First Lutheran Church Pillager Meeting Minutes

Opening and Call to Order: 6:32 PM on April 11, 2023.

Present: Lynda Converse, Diane Wright, Shirley Smith, Nicole Buersken, Julie Hofius, Dan Jacobson, Mike Bellos, Pastor Matthew Sundquist, and Kirstie Sundquist. Absent: Connie Vieths, Tammy Barnett.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Matthew asked that the council start giving him feedback at council meetings on the church services so he can continue to develop and adapt as necessary; some positive feedback by council was given. There was no updated news to add to the pastor's report.

Treasurer's Report: There was discussion on the treasurer's report with a brief review of the change that had been made at the last meeting regarding the 4% amount (previously 8%) now being put into the building maintenance fund and missions fund. Motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Shirley, seconded by Julie, and the motion passed.

Approval of Agenda and Secretary's Report: There was short discussion over the report and Mike made the motion to approve, Diane seconded, and the motion passed.

Committee Updates:

Worship/Music: The ordination for Pastor Matthew will be held during the May 7th church service and Pastor Jim Tetlie will conduct the ordination portion of the service. Pastor Matthew will be holding a new member class on April 30th and will have the new member church service on May 21 st. The high school senior church service will be held on May 28th. Dan suggested the council look for pianist/musician backups for times with Rita is unavailable. Pastor Matthew said that it had been suggested that the church purchase more banners to decorate the church for special Sunday services.

Church Community Communication Committee: Lynda said that the next committee meeting will be held on April 25 th at 3:00 PM. There was positive feedback in response to the mailers that had been sent out. She said that the church can apply for a nonprofit association number (NPA) to cut the cost on the mailers, which could allow more mailers to be sent out in a larger radius. She will get the application for the NPA. She also reported that the committee is planning on sending out a mailer in the fall with an updated schedule of events. Pastor Matthew suggested that a note be included on the mailers stating that the mailer recipients who bring in the mailer to a church service can redeem the mailer for a free coffee travel tumbler, which would help track the effectiveness of the mailers. Discussion was held on setting a budget for the travel tumblers, or potentially other items like t-shirts, since Pastor Matthew said he can use his Cricut machine to put the church name on tumblers or t-shirts. Pastor Matthew said after the Easter service a churchgoer offered a \$1,000 donation to be put toward a church playground and discussion was held about a location to install the playground. With the number of children growing in the church, the Sunday School room is becoming too small and Dan suggested Robert Buersken and Steve Roberts be consulted about adding more Sunday School spaces or rooms in the basement.

Hospitality: It was agreed that the donut breakfast downstairs before the Easter service, instead of after the service, was a nice way to still partake in fellowship and then families could leave after the service to spend time together; the intention is to continue the donut breakfast beforehand again next year. There was nothing further to report.

Sanctuary: The grocery/supply list will be purchased with a magnet on the back to be put on the fridge in the kitchen so that supply needs can be easily communicated. There was nothing further to report.

Facilities/Building: Don Gehrke has been troubleshooting the dishwasher issues with a contractor to solve the clogging and pump problems, and a plumber may need to come and replace the water line. Since the dishwasher is not used frequently it was suggested that the cleaning solution be run through after each use to prevent clogging issues. Nicole gave an update on the roofing and siding labor quotes she has been receiving and will create a spreadsheet to compare the quotes. It was suggested that the church's insurance inspect the roof for hail damage since there was a strong hail storm last year. Dan will be looking at the parsonage lighting to determine the issues. Pastor Matthew will be contacting the sound technician group to have a service person evaluate the quirks in the church's sound system. Justin from Horizon Plumbing and Heating will be sending over several air conditioner options with pricing.

Staffing: Kirstie will be going to graduate school, starting in September, and will be absent from church once a month. She has a person in mind to stand in for her in the tech booth. Nothing further to report.

Missions: Julie reported that the missions meeting was held on April 10th and they worked on identifying when to begin raising awareness and funds for Operation Christmas Child. The missions committee will be creating a fishing-themed float for the Pillager parade on July 8th. They also voted to donate missions funds to Aaron Geddes from Mission Aviation Fellowship, a group that flies in to isolated locations to bring the news of the gospel and distribute health care items, food, and education supplies. Julie also said that although the Soup Kitchen is set with a full volunteer roster, Timber Bay will likely need volunteers to help serve meals. The next missions meeting will be held on June 12th at 6:30 PM.

Old Business: Julie will reach out to Tom Kavanaugh to start discussing the Fall Dinner menu. Kirstie asked that events be reported to Connie by the 15th of each month so Connie will have time to include them in the newsletters.

New Business: Two requests have been made to borrow tables and chairs for graduation parties and they will be counted and signed out for each party. Dan said that he has been successfully added by the bank as a signer for the church and the past signers have been removed. Julie will be getting herself added as a signer as well.

Adjournment: Shirley made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Nicole, and motion passed. Minutes respectfully submitted by Nicole Buersken, Secretary.




EVENTS COMING UP IN MAY!
