Pastor made visits this week.

Treasurer's Report

Reviewed the Treasurer's report for April 2021. Discussion on two t.v.'s for on pillars for back part of church. Pastor will check with Digital Horizons. Commercial insurance renewal is coming due. It has gone up again, Tammie will check into other companies. Still working on the name change which was not recorded with the State for paperwork for the bank. Bob Harmsen made a motion to allow Council President Tom Kavanaugh, Council member Shirley Smith authority for numbers 1-6, and Treasurer Tammie Barnett authority for number 3 as described in Resolution of Lodge, Association or Other Similar Organization for Pine River State Bank. Motion seconded by Julie Hofius. All voted in favor. Motion carried. Motion by Mike Bellos to accept the Treasurer's report. Motion seconded by Shirley Smith. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report

The Secretary's Report from April 2021 was reviewed. Bob Harmsen made a motion to accept the Secretary's report. Seconded by Mike Bellos. All in favor. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

- *Worship/Music: Live Streaming will be installed June 8th. A contact has been established for any questions we may have about live streaming music and videos. Annual copyright \$137, Song Select \$165. Motion by Bob Harmsen to approve Wendy Jacobson and Pastor Matthew to get copyright & streaming up to \$1,500 annually. Seconded by Shirley Smith. All in favor. Motion carried. Start-up of choir and pianist planned for fall.
- *Youth/Family: Last Sunday School class this Sunday. Youth will be planning for a Family Fun Night for late summer.
- *Communication: They are currently in beginning stages of Website updates.
- *Hospitality: The Church has had a request to borrow chairs for a graduation. Council approved with someone available to check them out and back in. Request for use of the church this coming Saturday from 10 am to early afternoon. Will have someone come open up and close up afterwards. Dishwasher has not been working as the seals have dried out due to non-use. Need to run at least once a month to keep it working well.
- *Sanctuary: Memorial fund for making more of the windows stained glass in the church will be started.
- *Facilities/Building: Will try to pour concrete slab on May 22. We can rent press pad for pattern and will color the cement. Stair railing at the parsonage will get a quote for materials and then for labor. Have an estimate for cleaning all the church windows for \$112.01. Will get a quote for the parsonage also; if similar quote, will have parsonage windows done also. Motion by Shirley Smith to have the windows done. Seconded by Julie Hofius. Motion carried. Priced a computer for live streaming system for \$1,200 to \$1,400. Motion to authorize purchase of computer for up to \$1,500 by Bob Harmsen. Seconded by Dan Jacobson. All in favor. Motion carried.

- *Call/Negotiating Committee: No report.
- *Welcome/Visitor's Committee: New member Sunday will be in June.
- *Missions: Will work on group getting together in the fall. Possibly participate in the fair. Will discuss VBS at the next meeting.

Tammie Barnett contacted four different insurance companies for quotes. There was only one response from Church Mutual. Guest, Cory Knott of Church Mutual, gave the Council an insurance update including coverage we should have but do not have currently. He explained all the coverages and answered questions.

Pastor's Report

Pastor will be conducting a class on July 11th for new members (anyone is welcome), the New Member Sunday will be July 18th. Discussed duties of the church secretary and ideas of how to communicate more efficiently between Council, Church Secretary, and Pastor Matthew and Kirstie. As many duties have changed with Covid, clarification is necessary to be more efficient.

Treasurer's Report

Discussed CTC internet charges and speeds. We may require faster internet speed for streaming the church services.

A discussion was had regarding a Tech position to assist with the Church Secretary position. With all the technology changes in running services, so many things have changed and require more time and preparation. Currently, taking approximately 10 hours per month. Mike Bellos will meet with Kirstie and Connie to go over job descriptions and duties.

Adjourned: Shirley Smith made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mike Bellos. Motion carried.






Funeral services was on Tuesday, July 6, 2021 at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Crosby. Burial was at the Mission Township Cemetery.
