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## Focus on the Objective

## In Who's Image?

So God created man in his own own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. Genesis 1:27

God created both you and your spouse in his image; therefore, it is important to recognize this when you are communicating. Do you know you are investing words into your spouse's spirit, which is the part that resembles God? Do you know your spouse is a living expression of God himself? That was his (God's) intentions from the very beginning of time. Your words not only affect your spouse's thoughts and emotions, but also their spirit. 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## **Making Spiritual Investments**

Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. Galatians 6:7

The above passage is sharing with us that what we put into something is what we will get out of it. If you want a fruitful marriage in Jesus Christ, than it is important to make the appropriate investments that will increase your chances for such results. One important area that needs strong spiritual investments is communication. Do you know that every time you speak words to your spouse you are investing in the quality of your lives together? them in a manner that does not invite corruption. Think of a beautiful diamond. How brilliant can it shine if covered under a heavy residue of corrosion? God meant for your marriage to be a shining reflection of the joy that two people can share if they entreat one another through his nature. Making the appropriate choice to communicate your differences is critical toward your emotional growth in Christ. ## **Respect Diversity**

## There must be a Willing Attitude

It is difficult to have effective communication without cooperation and openness. Have you ever had challenging moments in your marriage and tried to communicate with your spouse only to realize that your spouse refused communication with you? This keeps a wall between you both until the situation is resolved. God does not want communication barriers to exist; therefore, make sure that you are not the one rejecting communication. Instead, protect your marriage from cold, distant, and broken interaction by allowing God to help you overcome all obstacles. There are times when we allow the

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smallest differences to keep us from healthy interaction with our spouse. These kinds of things escalate and before long, we close off our ears to listening and refuse to open up. The idea is to rationally discuss any matter and keep in mind the importance of being open.
