The following credit requirements are based on the Texas state requirements for a high school diploma. The state of Texas does not require that courses be taken in any particular order; however, some courses may have prerequisite knowledge (i.e., math). If a specific course is required by the state (i.e., U.S. History), it is listed in bold. The courses in the chart are offered at LCA; see the course catalog for specific course descriptions. Not all courses will be offered every year; course offerings will depend on enrollment. Minimum enrollment in each class is 5 students. LCA might agree to offer the class with a slight fee increase, to be shared by each participating student's family, if minimum enrollment is not met.

- 2. Cross out classes that your student has already successfully completed.
- 3. Circle classes that you would like your student to take this school year.
- 4. If your student needs more than one course in a particular subject, please write the school year that you would prefer your student to take each class (i.e., 2019/2020, 20/21). This will help with planning future course offerings.
