# A Message From The Missionaries in Haiti

From Covid-19, protests, the assassination of the President, a 7.2 earthquake, rising inflation, kidnappings, and civil unrest, 2021 was an extremely difficult and devastating year for Haiti. Still, Haiti continues to persevere through the challenges they face and continues to show the world their resilience through life's hardest battles! To provide more insight and clarity on the details of this past year and the current reality of Haiti, here are some first hand updates from one of our missionaries, Ashely Wojton.

## *The Assassination Of President Jovenel*

We have experienced many affects of the assassination of the President in July of 2021. While a Prime Minister has taken over the role of the President, he is not hands on like the previous President was. Currently, the gangs run the country and while they are far away from Les Cayes, it has led to numerous problems in our town. For instance, the gangs control part of the road between the capital and our city in the south. That being said, the gangs then get to decide if and when supplies and gas get through. This causes gas prices to rise to \$25/gallon and the price of food to skyrocket. There are also certain food items only made in the capital that are extremely hard to come by, such as sliced bread for example. There seems to be no intervention by the current administration in power to stop or control the gangs.

Due to the unsafe circumstances, we are also unable to travel to the capital, Port au Prince, via car or bus. Anyone that needs to travel for personal or urgent medical intervention, needs to travel by plane or helicopter from Les Cayes. This complicates the already fragile medical care system. Not only are hospitals here not able to get supplies, gas, oxygen, or staff to properly run the hospital, but they are also unable to send patients to a better hospital for critical treatment.

## *The Effects Of The Earthquake*

Les Cayes was hit by the largest earthquake in modern history on August 14, 2021. While it did not cause the amount of deaths as the January 12, 2010 earthquake, it still killed and estimated 2,248 deaths and left thousands homeless. While the children were scared, the orphanage had minor damage to the building and the school year only had to be delayed six weeks to complete the repairs. Many are still traumatized from the earthquake with aftershocks happening everyday.

## *Providence Academy Updates*

We finally opened the school the first week of October, and missed 6 out of the first 10 days due to political unrest. Thankfully, we were able to complete the first quarter without interruption after these incidents. The staff and students at Providence Academy are doing as best as they can to work hard and focus on education, despite all of the trauma they have endured the past few months.

## *Kidnappings And Current Concerns*

While kidnappings have increased dramatically in Haiti over the past year, it is thankfully not something we see in our town. The US has stated concerns over February 7, 2022. This is the date President Jovenel was supposed to finish his presidential term and many believe that the current Prime Minister should step down at this time. With no election date in sight, it is unlikely that he will and this may cause nationwide protests forcing schools to close yet again. Given the circumstances, we are doing our best to stay positive and we are taking each day and crisis as it comes, one thing at a time. We are remembering what is important and trying to appreciate every moment with each other and every day that we get to go to school.
