LATEST NEWS IN HAITI

The last few years in Haiti have been particularly difficult, and this last year was unfortunately no different. Haiti's government continues to be led by what was supposed to be a transitional leader and has allowed the country to be taken over by gangs. These gangs have cut off much of the nation's supply chain – particularly in regards to the food supply. This has caused food prices to skyrocket to 3x's the normal prices – leaving people hungry and choosing between educating their children, maintaining their business, or putting food on the table. Beacuse of our

faithful donors, Hearts and Hands has been able to assist FEP and our community families to make ends meet, but it has not been easy. Certain foods, such as meat, have become a luxury and our families are feeling the strain. Please join us in continuing to pray for the people of Haiti. Pray for peace in the streets and boldness in the government to begin to stand up for their people and make decisions that will provide stability for their citizens.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR MISSIONARY

"While things were relatively quiet for the month of December, things are heating up here again in Haiti. This month over 10 police officers were killed in gang violence. The police are frustrated by the lack of support by the government, and their lives being on the line daily. Gangs continue to make ground everyday, with little pushback. Many schools are still closed in the capital, and with the gangs growing everyday, this will be a reality for more and more children each passing day. Universities have stopped, government offices have limited hours and there is no end in sight. The cost of living has increased 3xs what it was. It makes life almost impossible for most. We are constantly living life on the edge, because Haiti is constantly seconds away from shutting down again. For our girls this means constant interrupted education, lack of variety in their diets because some food is just too expensive now, and knowing at any time we may need to shelter in place. We don't know what hope there is for the future generations. We don't know if or when they will continue their education, and even if they do, what jobs will be available when they finish." --- Ashley Wojton

HUMANITARIAN PAROLE

Due to the ongoing instability in Haiti, the US has opened up humanitarian parole as a way for Haitians to enter the United States legally and safely for a period of 2 years. To be eligible, Haitians must be over 18 or accompanied by a parent, and have a valid passport. In order for Haitians to be approved for entry to the US, they must also have a sponsor who agrees to financially support the individual and help them access available services, such as school, English classes, medical care, and employment opportunities.




So, what does this mean for Hearts and Hands? There are currently a handful of girls at FEP who are eligible and have the desire to come to the United States. This means that they have the opportunity to move to the United States for the next 2 years, finish their high school education, and begin exploring options moving forward – whether that be career training, college, or seeking employment. We have started the application process for eight of the girls to obtain authorization to travel to the US and hope to see this approved soon! We have a host family who will be providing a place to stay and help them enroll in school. Hearts and Hands would like to continue to support the girls during their stay in the United States, particularly while they are finishing school. At this time, sponsorships are used to provide for proper nutrition and education. Our hope is to be able to continue to support those same goals in the United States. Hearts and Hands will continue to provide for food, basic necessities and educational expenses - like school supplies, school fees, etc. If you feel led to help in additional ways such as travel expenses, long term costs, work authorization fees, medical expenses, counseling, or additional monthly support for any of these girls, please contact us and we can set that up! 

With the most limited passport in the world, there is little to no chance to escape when things escalate, so I meant what I said when I said Biden's program is a miracle, and we know that it might not last long." -- Ashley Wojton
