Seven Springs, Inc.

"This water has always been good here. It gets filtrated through the sandhills, it's filtered better than anywhere else, and all our water tests pull up higher than normal on the good stuff and way low on the bad stuff," reports Seven Springs, Inc. Manager Todd Thornton.

In 1997, a group of investors decided it was time to

bottle up all the goodness from the sandhills purification system by offering 100% natural spring water, bottled and delivered.

Seven Springs bottled water is found in local and regional grocery stores and gas stations. Folks know the drinking water is coming right from Long Pine's Seven Springs.

"The water comes in off the city line, so it allows us to use the city testing and filtration system. It then goes into our tank and into our ozonator, which splits the molecules of oxygen. So instead of H2O, we have H2O2, which kills bacteria and pathogens. And it's filtered naturally and it's just a lot better tasting water," explains Thornton.

Tens of thousands of gallons of water are distributed every year, from 5-gallon fills down to half-liters.
