Improvements and Updates Around the Village

Manorhaven Preserve

The Village secured funding from former Assemblywoman Gina Sillitti's office to finish the pavers and entryways in the Preserve Trail. All work was completed in the fall.

Oyster Garden

The Village of Manorhaven Oyster Garden is in full swing! This year-round garden will benefit all residents and future generations.

Beautification Projects

The Village purchased and planted a Douglas Fir at the triangle at Manorhaven Boulevard and Orchard Beach Road. The planting took place in late fall and further beautifies the space.



Road Work

Through the Department of Transportation State Funding, the Village acquired new road repair equipment, including a new asphalt transporter and asphalt roller. No Village taxes were spent on the acquisition.

The Village continues to seek funds through the HUD CBGB Grant program for ongoing sewer relining repairs in the most at-risk areas. Confirmation on receiving funds for the upcoming cycle year is imminent.
