

Did You Know: Tasmanian Devils

The Tasmanian Devil is known as Sarcophilus. This animal is a mammal and carnivore. Its average lifespan in the wild is up to five years. Its size varies between 20 to 31 inches. It weighs between 9 to 26 pounds. Tasmanian Devils are the largest carnivore, meat-eating animals. Tasmanian Devils live in Australia. In fact, Tasmania is the only place where they are found. I like Tasmanian devils because I think they are cute. I think they're cute because of how fluffy they are. They look like baby bears because of their coarse brown and black fur. They have a great sense of smell and sight which helps them avoid predators and locate prey. When they have babies they are born very little and are about the size of a raisin.
