




Hi, my name is Becca! I like to listen to the music of Taylor Swift. Her music makes me happy. I hope these lyrics inspire you as well:

This Month In History - The Civil Rights Act

Did you know that on July 2nd 1964, the Civil Rights Act was signed? Before this act was passed, discrimination was all over the place and made things unfair for all sorts of people.
