



History of Fireworks

If it seems like fireworks have been a staple of Independence Day in the U.S. since almost the beginning, that's because they have! Fireworks have been a part of cultural celebrations – especially in China – for centuries.

Our Founding Fathers were quick to adopt it as a show of patriotic pride. In 1776, then-future President John Adams sent a letter to his wife, Abigail, outlining how the country's declared independence from England should be celebrated. He wrote that the day should be marked with "pomp & parade, with shows, games, sports, bonfires, bells and illuminations from one end of this continent to the other from this time forward forever more."

The next year, a July 4th fireworks display in Philadelphia began and ended with 13 rockets, according to American University historian James R. Heintze. "The evening was closed with the ringing of bells, and at night there was a grand exhibition of fireworks, which began and concluded with thirteen.

So next time fireworks go off near you, don't forget that they have been lighting up the night skies all across America since 1777!

A Productive Summer


