How it's Possible: How to Make a Lollipop

The ingredients that are needed to make homemade lollipops are:

- Cooking Spray
- 1 cup Sugar • ½ cup light corn syrup
- ¼ cup water
- 1 ½ teaspoons extract of choice, such as vanilla, mint, or cinnamon
- Food coloring is optional
- Steps to Making a Homemade Lollipop:
- 1. Gather all of the ingredients needed 2. Spray lollipop molds with the cooking spray. Then, with a paper towel wipe any excess oil in the mold.
- 3. Push one lollipop stick in each hole in the mold.
- 4. Mix the sugar, corn syrup, and water together. Then, slowly pour it into a saucepan over medium-
- high heat. 5. Continue to mix until sugar completely dissolves while smoothing out the sugar crystals that stick
- to the edge of the pan with a pastry brush. 6. Once the mixture begins to boil place a candy thermometer inside the saucepan. Without stirring, wait until the candy reaches 300 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 7. Turn off the heat and remove the saucepan from the stovetop. Allow the candy to cool until it
- stops bubbling completely. Stir in the extract and/or food coloring of choice. 8. Slowly pour the candy into each mold cavity until it fully covers the stick.
- 9. Let lollipops sit for 10 minutes or until completely cooled and hardened. Remove lollipops from molds and enjoy

In 1964, there was a major British Invasion in the United States. 
Fun Shows! Pound Puppies
