

The First Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is a holiday that celebrates the coming together of early settlers and Native



Americans who feasted on deer, corn, shellfish, and roasted meat. The area near the site of the first Thanksgiving is now known to many as Southeastern Massachusetts and Eastern Rhode Island. This was the home of the Wampanoag people for over 12,000 years. Other European settlers also visited this area before the Mayflower ship arrived in 1620 with tons of people wanting to come to New England. In the 19th Century, people started to celebrate a modernized version of Thanksgiving, with people celebrating it nationally. Today it is known as a holiday that brings families together to feast and give thanks.

Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a national holiday celebrated yearly on November 11. This holiday honors army veterans of the United States Armed Forces, who were released under circumstances other than shamefulness. Major hostilities of World War I were ceremoniously ended when the Armistice with Germany became enforceable on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. Major US veteran organizations urged that the holiday get renamed Veterans Day in 1954 while it was originally known as Armistice Day. Since it is a federal holiday, some American workers and many school students have the day off from work or school. When Veterans Day falls on a Saturday, people may have off from work or school the day before, while if it falls on a Sunday, then people might have the day off from work or school the day after. Non essential businesses are closed. There is no mail delivered. All federal workers are paid for Veteran's Day. People who need to work on Veterans Day sometimes acquire additional holiday pay for Veterans Day along with their paycheck. Veterans Day celebrates all American veterans, alive or deceased, but mostly gives thanks to living veterans who served our country with honor during wars.
