The BCLM Pony Club Dressage and Show Jumping Championships is a Pony Club competition run in accordance with Canadian Pony Club rules and policies, which apply to all persons involved, including members, spectators, coaches, and volunteers. All BC Pony Club Regions invited to enter competition.

Statement of Principle: The motto of the Canadian Pony Club is: Loyalty, Character and Sportsmanship. Therefore, at all times and in all ways pertinent to the Club, the members, volunteers, and employees shall honour and conduct themselves with the purity and intent of this motto. The Canadian Pony Club:

- As an affiliate of Equestrian Canada, adopts its Code of Ethics;
- Cares about members of all ages and recognizes and respects the personal integrity of each member, volunteer and employee and their freedom to strive for quality and excellence;
- Is committed to upholding the welfare and safety of horses;
- Is committed to voluntarism and acknowledges the importance of appropriate role models;
- Supports the equal and just treatment of its members, volunteers and employees; and
- Commits to the highest quality of educational programmes, within its resources, in the care, management, riding and competitive activities of horses that reflect positively on the quality, safety and unique nature of the equestrian disciplines to which it is committed and that reflect the highest ideals of competence, safety and knowledge available to the Club.



Competition Rings: Outdoor arenas, with sand footing. Competition rings will be open for schooling on October 3, 2025 from 3pm to 8pm.

Farrier: If a farrier is needed it is the participant's responsibility to arrange.

Vet: TBD.

Stabling: Stabling and tack stalls are available and will be assigned. Cost of stalls is \$120.00 for the weekend (from 3pm on Friday to 7pm on Sunday). Stalls include shavings. Stalls must be stripped at the end of the weekend. If you don't strip them, you will be charged \$75 and the show committee will have to clean it. **if you are planning to ride on Friday you must pay a \$30 ring use fee**

Camping: FREE camping on cross-country field. No power. Showers onsite. Camping will be done on a first-come basis and will not be assigned. Absolutely no swimming in the river unless a certified lifeguard is present.

Haul-in Horses: All horses not stabled on the grounds must pay a **daily** haul-in grounds fee of \$35.00 for each day.

Concession: Ranch Pub and Grill Restaurant services onsite.

Awards: See eligibility for entry requirements to qualify for division and level awards.

- Dressage and Jumping divisional prizes for Champion and Reserve Champion
- · Individual class placings first through sixth for each dressage test and jumper round
- Prizes first through third for Medals
- Freestyle Champion and placing ribbons awarded immediately after Freestyles are completed.

Eligibility: Competitors **must** enter the appropriate level dressage division. For jumper division **do not** enter more than 3" below your tested riding height (open division available for riders wishing to ride outside their eligibility). Entry changes or additions are not permitted during the competition; no changes will be accepted after the closing date. Riders entering in more then one division can only qualify for one championship, the higher division entered will qualify for the championship prizes.

Branch DCs must sign entries before they will be accepted to ensure members are in good standing and are competing within their level.

Open Classes: Open to Horse Masters, and Pony Clubbers wishing to compete below the requirements for their level high point. Open Division High Point will be awarded.

Entries: The organizing committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries, refuse any entry for any reason, or split, cancel, combine, and or adjust any class or awards presented subject to entries and at their sole discretion.



Tack and Dress: Helmets and gloves are required to be worn while mounted. Failure to do so may result in elimination. Boots with heels are required (either tall boots or paddock boots with matching colored half chaps with a zipper or continuous Velcro). Riders are expected to be dressed neat and tidy: light-coloured (tan or white) breeches with a collared shirt with rat catcher or tie (no choker pins for jumping) and riding jacket. Pony Club pins with level disc should be worn on left lapel. Jackets may be waived, or rain jackets allowed, at judge's discretion. Horses and ponies should be braided and well-turned out. Hard and/or inflatable body protector vests may be worn for any portion of the competition on the outside of other garments. Inflatable body protectors may be worn without a hard vest for dressage and show jumping. Body protectors must meet or exceed ASTM F1937 or BETA Level 3 safety standards.

Appeals/Protests/Objections: Any protests are to be handled according to the CPC National Show Jump Rulebook and CPC National Dressage Rulebook. See 8.4.2 of the Dressage Rulebook, and 1.7.3 of the Show Jump Rulebook. In the spirit of good sportsmanship, appeals, protests, and objections are discouraged.

Ride Times: Will be sent out by email by Wednesday October 1, 2025. Order of go will follow the show program both for dressage and jumping, **no exceptions**.

Numbers: Competition numbers assigned and provided by the show office are required to be worn by the horse when outside the stall. Failure to display the number may result in elimination.

Tack Check: It's the responsibility of the competitor to present themselves to the designated tack check at least half an hour before their ride time. Failure to do so may incur elimination. No changes can be made after tack check. If a change is made, the rider must report back to the tack check.

Test Calling: Dressage tests may be called. Tests are available on the CPC Website or EC Website depending on test.

Whips: May be used in both Dressage and Show Jumping. Dressage whips 120cm (horse) and 100cm (pony). Jumping crops/bats must be under 75cm.

Horse Boots: May not be worn in the dressage competition ring.

Coaching: Keeping in mind safety and the principles of Pony Club, coaching is allowed during the competition **EXCEPT** when the competitor is in the competition ring (EC Article E 6.7). Coaches/callers must be dressed appropriately when in the warm up and/or competition ring (ie. No sandals). Coaching from outside the ring while the competitor is in the competition ring will result in elimination.

Volunteers: As this is a volunteer-run event, each participant/competitor is expected to provide a volunteer for a **minimum 4-hour volunteer shift**. See following page for volunteer role descriptions and experience needed. SignUpGenius will be used this year and sent to the email you provided on the entry approximately two weeks prior to before the competition.

Jumper Division Breakdown

RING 1 - No cross entry with Ring 2

- Fences will be simple and plain, with max of ten jumps presented, lines are set up to encourage success.
- Each Division will have two rides on the same course, with a short break in between each ride.
- 1st ride "Match the Clock" round closest to the optimum time with the fewest faults wins,
- 2nd ride "Clear" round best time clear with no faults, immediately followed by timed jump off.
- Fastest jump off time with fewest faults wins.
- Note ***riders exceeding the time limit will be eliminated***
- Optimum time is set by the course designer and displaced on the course plan posted near entrance of arena

RING 2 – No cross entry with Ring 1

- Fences will be colourful and interesting; course is set up with a degree of difficulty in a typical jumper fashion with a max of 12 jumps to be presented.
- Each Division will have two rides on the same course, with a short break in between each ride.
- 1st ride "Match the Clock" round closest to the optimum time with the fewest faults wins,
- 2nd ride "Clear" round best time clear with no faults, immediately followed by timed jump off.
- Fastest jump off time with fewest faults wins.
- Note ***riders exceeding the time limit will be eliminated***
- Optimum time is set by the course designer and displaced on the course plan posted near entrance of arena.
