

# **BCLM Rally Frequently Asked Questions 2025**

Please read the BCLM and National Rally rules and follow them to make this a fun and fair competition for everyone. At any time, if you have questions, PLEASE ask your Rally Rep or the Rally Chair.

#### What is the cost of Rally?

Rally is all inclusive for participants (camping, stabling, meals, competition). Fees are \$350 per BCLM participant and \$375 for non-BCLM members.

#### What does the Rally schedule typically look like?

Wednesday: Stables setup day (optional, no horses unless paying for additional day)

**Thursday**: Horses arrive & finish setup, Opening ceremonies, Stable Management ABC judging (D teams &HM receive feedback only), Captains/Riders Meeting with TD, Evening Social (Mug Up)

Friday: Trot-up, Dressage, Stable Management, Captains Quiz & Group Game, Mug Up

**Saturday**: Cross country, Stable Management, Grooms Round, Mug Up **Sunday**: Trot-up, Stadium jumping, closing ceremonies & tear down

#### What are the additional fun activities for this year?

- This year's theme is Neon Disco (the 70's era). Teams are encouraged to dress in theme or team
  colours for the opening ceremonies and incorporate/decorate the stable area (tack room/stall
  chart/feed chart/etc) in this theme as you'd like. There will be a Best Decoration Award
  presented!
- Team skits may be back again for an evening's entertainment during Mug Up (hot chocolate).
- Swimming / playing in the creek is back for a relaxing afternoon activity. Bring your swimsuit and water shoes/sandals help too.
- Swimming is allowed during **designated** days/times with a lifeguard on duty.
- A supervisor must accompany each group along the dyke and stay at the swimming hole
- Pinnies are to be worn along the dyke only remove them to swim.

## What is does 'Setup' consist of?

- Setup of stalls, tack and feed rooms any time after 12pm Wednesday, in assigned stalls only.
- Horses to arrive on Thursday. If you need to bring your horse on Wednesday fill out that form on your Entry and pay stall fee to BCLM rally. Note: if you ride your horse on Wednesday you must pay for a MREC day pass and are only allowed to use the warm-up ring.

# How do I get my entry package (numbers, pinny, etc.)?

- Show office opens Thursday at 10:00am.
- Branch Rally Reps will bring passports for their branch members along with completed facility waivers.
- Team Packages will only be distributed once paperwork is complete, and passports handed in.
- Package includes: 1 pinny per participant, official program, rider number, course map
- Packages must be picked up before the Opening ceremonies as each participant is required to wear their pinny when rally officially starts.

## When does Rally officially begin? What happens?

- Opening ceremonies are at 2:00pm on Thursday.
- Teams gather in team or theme colours for a parade of participants. No horses at the ceremonies.

## As a participant, where can (or cannot) I be?

- Members are to be at rally from Thursday Opening ceremonies till end of rally tear down and may not leave the grounds without special permission from the Rally Chair.
- No one is to walk the XC alone there are bears and general public on the back trails!
- Members are not to go out onto cross country field or dyke in the late evenings due to bear activity.
- Lights-out is at 9:30pm each night. Members are not to use office washroom or be by stalls after this time.
- The MREC Restaurant/Lounge is out of bounds to all competitors during Rally.

## How does the judging work?

- Participants can be judged at all times during rally points are deducted if judges notice anything amiss.
- All team members must always have their pinnies on so that officials know who everyone is.
- Stable Management (SM) judging occurs at specific times at the stable area.
- Riders are judged for their various ridden portions of the competition, and the rider's stable management score also affects their placing.
- The team is also judged on certain aspects such as trot-up and cool out procedures. Make sure to get the trot up and cool out procedures from your rally rep so all members can review

## Who can help participants at Rally?

- Rally is meant for participants to showcase their horsemanship learnings in a safe, team-based environment. Participants are the "sole" caregivers for their team's horses.
- Teams may have help with setup and take down (i.e. before and after the competition) of their stabling area.
- Once Rally officially begins, <u>instruction or assistance during the competition is not allowed in the stabling and riding areas</u> except from fellow competitors, judges, coaches and rally officials.
- For rider's safety, a ring steward will be at each warm-up phase and a coach will be available for course walks. The intent of the Ring Stewards is to support safety of the competition and Coaches will be able to advise on questions asked by participants.

Other coaches are allowed but must be insured (same as for teaching PC sessions) and be willing to support regarding any safety issues and to answer questions asked by any participant. Captains are allowed to support team members during competition. It is highly recommended that each Rider meet with their regular riding instructor and Captain to ensure an appropriate warm-up plan is in place for the Rider and their horse/pony.

#### What should I pack?

A weekend competition means a lot of things to bring for you, your team, and your horses! See the **Rally Equipment &Stable Management Setup** list on the <u>BCLM Rally webpage</u>.

#### What equipment and stable management items do I need to know?

- Review Rally Equipment & Stable Management Setup list <u>BCLM Rally webpage</u> for required items.
- For tack room: if you do not feel comfortable having your saddle in overnight:
  - o Thursday night SM only need dressage tack (saddle, bridle)
  - o Friday night SM need dressage and cross-country tack (saddle, bridle)
  - o Saturday night SM need cross country and stadium tack (saddle, bridle)
  - All saddle pads and splint boots used need to remain in tack or feed room for the weekend.

#### What signage do I need to create?

Horse charts or posters must be created by each participant to share some information about themselves and either the horse/pony brought to Rally or another mount back at home. Themes can be incorporated!

Each team needs to have some posters/charts created to help share information about themselves and their horses/ponies.

- **Team Poster** includes info on team such as team name, entry numbers and pictures about your team. Gets posted in your tack room.
- Horse/Rider Poster 1 per horse/pony; gets posted on the stall door. Must include:
  - o Rider name, age, PC level
  - o Team number and name
  - o Horse breed, height, gender, colour, age, division level competing, usual TPR
  - Usual Farrier name & phone #, usual Vet name & phone #
  - Rally Farrier name & phone #, Rally Vet name & phone # (will be supplied to Captains)
- **Groom Poster** Grooms are also welcome to make up their own poster with information about themselves and a pony/horse they have or use. Gets posted in the tack room.
- Feed Schedule 1 per horse/pony; gets posted in the feed room. Must include:
  - o Team number and name
  - o Rider number
  - o Horse name
  - o Feed schedule
  - Medications must have vet/medication form with rally chair (on website)
  - o Note about water always being accessible and if succulents can be given.
  - o Grains for each feeding are to be kept in zip lock bags, labeled for day, feed time, etc. The zip lock bags are then kept in a rubber made tub.

#### What dressage tests will be used, and what help is allowed?

- **Dressage Tests** are EC Eventing 2023 tests as follows:
  - S69 (Starter) and PE77 (Pre-Entry) = EV85 Test 1
  - EV85 (Entry) = EV85 Test 2
  - EV90 (Pre-training) = EV90 Test 1
- During dressage, the rider may have a team member close the gate.
- D riders may have their tests called by a team member. ABC riders may not have their tests called.

## What do I wear?

• During the competition some specific clothing, footwear and accessories are required or preferred during certain phases/times. Please see the chart below.

Pony Club Pin	To be worn at all times EXCEPT by riders during x-country
Participant Pinny	To be worn at all times EXCEPT when swimming or sleeping. Also, pinnies are optional for riders in dressage and stadium
Paddock Boots	To be worn at all times in stable area &for trot-up (unless tall boots are worn)
<b>Team colours</b> : pants/shorts, shirts, socks	May be worn by grooms at all times, & by everyone in stable area, during trot-up and cool-down
Show attire: tall boots or paddock boots & matching half chaps, breeches shirt, stock/choker/tie with stock pin*, show jacket	To be worn by riders in dressage & stadium; may be worn by riders for trot-up if close to ride time (*no stock pin to be worn for stadium)
Cross-country attire: tall boots or paddock boots & matching half chaps, breeches, collared shirt	To be worn by riders in x-country (Note: no Pony Club pin)
Helmet	To be worn by riders & all participants in trot-up Must fit snugly with no hair bunched inside, & chin strap done up tight
Gloves	To be worn by riders & all participants in trot-up
<b>Body Protector</b> : must meet or exceed EC Requirements	Optional for riders in dressage & stadium. Required for x-country; Note: Rally exception to EC rule—riders may wear an air vest over a show jacket without a rigid vest, upon TD approval only
Stopwatch	Optional for riders in x-country
Whip	To be used in trot-up; optional for riders in all events: refer to EC rules re length

#### What horse-related things should I know?

- Only horses being used by the Riders should be brought to Rally.
- Horses must be suitable for rally environment as they will be handled by grooms & inspected by judges.
- Horses are allowed to be hand walked in the cross-country field for exercise, but not past first clump
  of trees. Do not present the horse to any jumps.
- No horses in the creek ever!
- Lunging is allowed in the dressage ring in the cross-country field only. To support safety, members lower than C2 need to partner with another qualified member (as per Pony Club testing requirements) to lunge a horse where necessary.
- Wash racks for horses must be kept clean and all manure to be picked up at the wash racks and areas surrounding the stables. Points will be deducted if items left behind.
- Review Pony Club trot-up and cool-out procedures and practice!
- Riders must be aware of the excessive whip use rule & understand the speed fault time for x- country.

#### What are some tack-related things to know?

- Tack that was used stays in tack room to show it was cleaned properly after use. All tack and equipment must remain in tack room from Thursday till Sunday (other than the saddles as specified below). Judges will be noting if tack has left the tack room once rally started.
- However, to guard against theft, saddles may be taken from tack room and locked up from 8pm-7am.
- If both dressage and jumping saddles are being used, then both saddles are to be in for Thursday's stable management inspection. After that, the jumping saddle can come out until Saturday. If needed, saddles can be stacked on top of each other for this situation. The dressage saddle can come out after Friday stable management inspection.
- Refer to EC rules for tack specifications for each phase: whip lengths, bit types, martingales etc.

#### What dressage tests will be used, and what help is allowed?

- Dressage Tests are EC Eventing 2023 tests as follows:
  - S69 (Starter) and PE77 (Pre-Entry) = EV85 Test 1
  - EV85 (Entry) = EV85 Test 2
  - o EV90 (Pre-training) = EV90 Test 1
- During dressage, the rider may have a team member close the gate.
- D riders may have their tests called by a team member. ABC riders may not have their tests called.

## How does the camping work?

- Camping area is designated to each branch. You will find a map showing the area for your branch at the stables.
- No cars may be parked on emergency road in camp area.
- Generators may run in designated times only- these will be given out at the supervisor meeting on Thursday.
- Lights out by 9:30pm. Participants need to get up early and be well-rested for the day.
- NO ALCOHOL in the camping area/during rally as per CPC rally rules. parents/supervisors need to drive members to emergency if need be
- NO SMOKING anywhere except in the front parking lot by the pub. MREC rules

- Dogs are allowed but must be on leash at all times and **ONLY in camp area.**
- No motorized vehicles allowed at Rally (mini bikes, mopeds, and scooters).
- No bikes in stable area at all.
- Showers are available for \$1.

## What do the Team Chaperones(Supervisors) do?

- There must be one chaperone per team designated at all times, to be responsible for the safety of youth during the event. We recommend creating a rotation and posting it at your campsite.
- Chaperones are the only non-participants allowed inside the stable area and **must wear their badges** when visiting the stables.
- Chaperones may bring snacks, drinks, and sunscreen to the stables at any time and are encouraged to make sure participants are staying well hydrated. No coaching or helping while at stables
- Chaperones should know where all the members of their team are at all times, and have emergency contacts posted at campsite.
- If any team members go to the creek for swim time, a Supervisor must be in attendance at the creek.
- Post the safety drill procedure. Captains and Chaperones are to know where to meet.
- Chaperones are to address any members of their branch not following rules. If you have any concerns about a member from another club, do not talk to them directly except to prevent an unsafe situation. For any non-emergency concerns, go directly to your Rally Rep or the Rally Chair. If you observe any parent breach, Rally Chair will address it.
- Chaperones must not consume alcohol.

#### What about participant meals and food?

- All participant meals, once Rally begins, are included: Thursday dinner, Friday lunch & dinner, Saturday lunch & dinner, and Sunday lunch.
- Parents and other attendees may eat at the on-site pub/restaurant.
- Hydration is key! Ensure you have a cooler with ice and cold drinks available in the team's tack room. Water bottle refilling stations will be available throughout the grounds.
- Breakfasts and snacks throughout the day are the responsibility of parents.
- Bears are around! Food areas must be left spotless to avoid attracting them. Pick up ALL garbage (teams could lose points for this). Captains and supervisors should check the meal area when the team leaves. The tent area where competitors eat MUST be left spotless.
- Garbage to be set out before 7 p.m. or else take directly to bins by restaurant, separate and use recycle bins please.

# Are there any other tips?

- **CELL phones** Cell phones are not allowed in the competition areas (stables, arenas, food tent, etc.) unless required for medical purposes (i.e. diabetes management, etc.). If a phone is required, the show committee must be advised. Cell phones may be kept in your camp area.
- D teams and ABC teams can ask to have an ABC mentor for support and guidance with any questions.
- There is always a communication board posted at the end of the stable for any notices or new info. Supervisors and Captains should check it regularly for information and updates.
- For any questions at any time, please ask the rally chair, who will gladly help everyone out

## What do we do when Rally ends?

- Tear down may commence after last Stadium Rider but must pause during closing ceremonies.
- Closing ceremonies will commence as soon as the scores are compiled (usually around 2pm).
- No vehicles are allowed in stable area until after closing ceremonies.
- All stalls must be completely stripped and spotless. They will be checked and if they do not pass inspection, your branch will be charged a \$125.00 clean out fee.
- Please thank all the volunteers!!
