

Grant Request #1

Stewart School: Steps to Success Grant

The goals of this grant will be to help support our current Steps to Success initiative for the 2025-2026 school year, and part of 2024-2025 school year. This will be supported by purchasing texts that provide a deeper understanding of the monthly steps through literacy and the rich, shared discussion that come out of these interactive read alouds and classroom connection.

Description for use of grant funds:

We are asking for the grant to fund 3 books per classroom in support of our Stewart Steps to Success:

- The Hard Hat by Jon Gordon
- I Can Do Hard Things by Gabi Garcia
- But It's Not My Fault by Julia Cook

Additionally we would like a token of remembrance that serves as a visual for our students to use the skills the program gives them in times of need. For this visual we would like to give each student a Stewart Steps to Success Jibbit. The design is included in this grant.

The only thing that was not accounted for was shipping in the cost breakdown.

Cost: \$2,554.00

Grant Request #2

High School: Quiet Pods

The goal of the grant is to provide quiet places for students to use in the library for a variety of purposes: to study, read, or just get some quiet moments to themselves for a mental break.

Description for use of grant funds:

The funds would purchase three individual enclosed phone booth pods equipped with seating, light, power and fan for fresh air. There are various options from different companies, but they are all basically the same in what they offer, and their size is basically all the same.

Student leaders suggested adding these types of booths so that they could have mental health breaks or quiet places in the midst of their busy days in the library that is always very busy. The library is always accessible so students can have access during the day.

Cost: \$18,000.00

Grant Request #3

Primary Schools: Speed Cups

The goal of this grant is to provide students at the primary level with another activity during indoor recess. On days with inclement weather this activity will allow students to improve their hand eye coordination skills. I would also like a set for each primary physical education program. There are times P.E. loses the MPR due to concerts, meetings, and other scheduling conflicts. This would be a great addition to the classroom physical education curriculum.

Description for use of grant funds:

Each primary classroom will get their own set of speed cups for indoor recess. This grant will service all three primary schools. Each physical education program will get their own set of speed cups as well. This activity is a great way to work on processing and hand eye coordination, in addition to fine motor skills for general education and special education students. The pack includes the cups, mats for stacking, and timers!

This grant will service every primary classroom, and provide a safe and “active” indoor recess option.

Cost: \$2,995.00

Grant Request #4

Homestead: Soccer Goals

The goal of this grant is to provide students at Homestead with a pair of soccer goals that can be used at recess. The goals will provide the students with a visual and reduce the discrepancy whether a shot is a goal or not. In addition, Homestead has thick brush around the perimeter of the soccer fields unlike the other two primaries. The layout of the field at Homestead is different than Locust and Hemlock which presents different obstacles. Several times throughout the game, students are entering the thick brush looking for the

ball regardless of the direction of the goals. The implementation of goals will reduce the amount of times the students need to go into the brush looking for the soccer ball.

Description for use of grant funds:

The grant will purchase two soccer goals that will be used everyday at recess. Dr. Viscovich purchased two goals this week. This grant will provide two more, allowing the two soccer fields to look equal in appearance.

This grant will service students at the Homestead school that choose to participate in soccer. This grant will reduce the amount of times the soccer ball gets lost in the thick brush found on the perimeter of the soccer field.

Cost: \$1,069.81
