Guidance Updates:

Presented by Ms. M. Stefankiewicz, Assistant Principal for Guidance and PPS; Ms. J. Kennedy, Guidance Counselor; Mr. R. Shanley, Guidance Counselor

- Guidance Spotlight: "Course Selections and Electives":
 - Course Selection process will begin next week; email to be sent out on January 25 with detailed instructions. Process will not pull students out during class time.
 - Paper course selection forms will be distributed during English classes on January 26 and 27; forms can also be found on the GCHS website under the Guidance Department tab on the left side where forms are listed by grade level. Forms show available electives with required prerequisites.
 - Forms are to be completed and signed by parent & student and will be collected during English class on January 28 and 29. Remote students should email completed form directly to their guidance counselor by January 29.
 - Students should complete all selection slots on the form including 3rd, 4th, 5th options or could end up with an unwanted study hall. Counselors do their best to accommodate 1st or 2nd choice, however, some courses are singletons with only one section offered and unable to fit into schedule.
 - Updated Course Description Guide can be found on the GCHS website under the Guidance Department tab and it includes detailed descriptions for each course including which grades the course is available to and required prerequisites. Be mindful of required course prerequisites.
 - Students can make an appointment or email their counselor with any questions.
 - Students needing Math, Reading and/or Speech support services sometimes do not have room in their schedule for electives. There will be opportunities for these students to take electives during later high school years.
- Course changes for next year include:
 - English 12R will now be a full year course. This change was made because some colleges did not accept the previously offered half year course combined with an English elective to meet graduation requirement for English. Film Appreciation and Creative Writing electives will still be offered but students must take the full year English 12R course or AP English Literature course in grade 12 to fulfill graduation requirement.
 - College Business Management course will now be offered to grades 10, 11 and 12.
 - Algebra 2 is a new non-Regents course to be offered for students who wish to learn Algebra 2 topics at a supportive pace and will replace the current Math 3 & Math 4 courses.
- All students are encouraged to join the Guidance Department Google Classroom which contains a wealth of information ranging from honors policy, scholarship opportunities, college planning kits, dates and summer program opportunities to grade level information and academic support resources. Code to join is: **ipujguk**

• College Board has eliminated SAT Subject Tests effective immediately and will no longer offer the optional essay with the SAT after the June 2021 administration of the exam; focus will shift to AP Exams going forward.

High School Updates: Mr. K. Steingruebner, Principal

- The number of students required to quarantine and those testing positive are leveling off. Currently reporting approximately one positive case per day on average.
- Garden City Community as a whole has seen the number of positive cases double from December to January when compared to number of positives from March to December.
- Predominately single cases are arising and not much contact tracing is needed.
- Nassau County Department of Health has changed the number of days required to quarantine from 14 days to 10 days after exposure or a positive test result. Some school districts are still using the 14-day quarantine rule and that impacts GCHS staff resulting in teachers working on remote. Some school districts have closed school buildings due to staff quarantine cases. GCHS has been able to anticipate and manage without closing the school building.
- There has been an increase in the number of students opting to go fully remote. We are now at approximately 200 compared to the steady number of approximately 40 students since the start of the school year.
- Low and Moderate Risk Winter Sports have begun. Recently held first Boys & Girls Fencing meet in the gym with students wearing masks beneath their headgear. Meet was broadcast for spectators utilizing two live-steam cameras one via YouTube and one via Zoom to see which method worked best.
- Winter Sports such as Riflery and Bowling have a different look as teams are not traveling to compete against other schools in-person. Scores are recorded and compared to determine winners.
- Adjustments are happening inside the school building in anticipation of having the senior class return to school every day. Desk shields are being installed and the Math wing classrooms were completed last week. SCOPE program has moved out of the high school and has returned to the Elementary school buildings. Date of full-time student return to be announced at the upcoming Board of Education meeting.
- GCHS Staff members are getting COVID vaccine.
- Science Research program continues to grow and now includes 150 students. Currently working on creating dedicated space for the program through plans that were in the works pre-COVID.
- Mr. Martin Malone's position as interim Assistant Principal has been posted to be filled.
- Normal planning has begun for traditional events such as Prom and Graduation to be prepared in the event that restrictions are lifted. Logistics to be worked out later.
- Winter Wonderland has been postponed due to the number of students in quarantine. The Student Council is working to reschedule the event in a format where students can attend in shifts.
- Skit Night has been canceled. It is not possible to hold the event in the traditional manner and planning for it will not happen at this point.
- Too early to start plans for other events such as Spring Fling or Senior Trip.
- GCHS continues to think outside the box to bring students together for traditional events. Appreciate suggestions and will say yes when possible as did with Student Food Drive and Clothing Drive.
- Many activities and events have already taken place this year in a modified format such as Bagels & Hot Cocoa for the senior class; Spirit Week (plans are in the works for a second Spirit Week in the spring); Senior Class Panoramic Photo; Sports Team Photos (will be photoshopped so students can take off masks); Athletic Signing Day; Extra Help; Club Fair was held outside; Mathletes and Speech & Debate events are taking place virtually; Parent Teacher Conferences; Financial Aid Night Presentation; ACT & SAT offered in person more than previous years.
- Yearbook is student driven. This year is especially challenging. The students are working hard to put together and meet deadlines.
- Open House for Eighth Graders videos created by each academic department will be posted on GCHS website alongside course selection form.

- Any update on when the new Chrome books will arrive? Still waiting on new Chrome Books.
- When are the elective sheets due?
 Forms will be collected during English class on. January 28 & 29. Remote students should email forms directly to their Guidance Counselor by January 29.
- Can you specify where Curriculum Coordinator videos will be/are being posted online?
 GCHS website under Our School tab Course Offerings. Theatre Arts is already up. Others to follow and will be sent out via eblast as well.
- Do you think the NYS Regents will be canceled again? New York State makes this decision and there is no indication as to when it will be announced. We are providing instruction and learning in line with the state and exam prep in case the State maintains the exam.

• Will quarterly grading be adjusted after Regents decision is made? Will the regents be rescheduled? If not, how does that affect students going forward?

Quarterly grading will be adjusted depending on Regents. Midterms were not given which were previously counted as 8% of final grade. Transcripts will show 'EXEMPT' from Regents and there will be no penalty for students.

- Some teachers still gave benchmark exams. They are counted as regular tests? Benchmarks count as an exam during Q2. Teachers are working with students to overcome testing challenges and remain flexible.
- Regarding sports...if we get approved to play low and high-risk sports in March have you made plans for this and if
 no spectators allowed do you the means to livestream games so parents can view the game? I believe that this is
 something that needs to be addressed.

Fall and Spring sports are still slated to be low and moderate risk. Fall sports are scheduled to begin in March and Spring sports are scheduled to begin in April. Decision on which sports are allowed rests with Section 8 and is not up to the school district. Assemblyman Ed Ra spoke out in favor of allowing students to play high risk sports and Nassau County Executive Laura Curran also voiced support. Plans are in place to livestream meets and games.

 Other districts have communicated about fall sports and BOE and AD advocating for the start of fall sports to start we have heard nothing from GC voicing support.
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- What is the high school doing to advocate for fall sports specifically football. We have seen in the news local assemblymen and senators advocating for football to start?
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- Will the AD try and do what was done last year for seniors in sports?
 Eamonn Flood, Athletic Director, has plans in the works for athletics.
