## Questions

- **What grades do 8<sup>th</sup> graders need to be put into honors?** The 95 average is per subject, first 3 quarters for 8<sup>th</sup> graders to be put into honors classes. It's difficult to drop a level and requires changes to the schedule. We want to students to be placed appropriately. Can place up the next year
- **In 9<sup>th</sup> grade do most students take a lunch period?** It's recommended to take a lunch in 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Math lab and extra help can happen during lunch. Good for socialization and relaxation. Students can use the library instead of the cafeteria
- **What is the counselor student ratio?** - 1:200 students - National average is 1:250
  - o Organized by alphabet
  - o Students can walk in, parents can call
- **Are we getting new cybersecurity AP?** Not right now- Currently we have Project Lead the Way program but it's not an AP. Will watch enrollment and maybe shift to AP. All

decisions are based on interest from students. You can take AP exams for courses we don't offer. Need 15 students to run an elective

- o To graduate you need 10<sup>th</sup> grade health class, 4 years of PE, 1 year of music or art
- **How early do you take college aspirations into account for class selection?** Always taking career interest inventory. College planning accounts – Naviance career readiness program will start sophomore year. Conversations with students start right away to evaluate their interests
- **When is orientation?** Last week of August when sports are starting
