**GENERAL REGULATIONS**

**§3-101. Definitions.**

As used in this Part:

**BICYCLE** — a device having two tandem wheels of a diameter not less than 10 inches and propelled by human power.

**STREET** — all public highways, boulevards, streets, lanes, alleys and all public places within the Borough of Philipsburg.

**§3-102. Manner of Operation.**

A bicycle shall be operated and parked in the manner required in the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

**§3-103. Applicability of Traffic Regulations.**

In accordance with the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania, it shall be unlawful for the operator of a bicycle to violate any traffic rules or ordinances of the Borough of Philipsburg or the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, that are applicable to bicycles or to motor vehicles. No person shall:

- A. Stop, stand or park a vehicle:
  - (1) On a sidewalk.
  - (2) Within an intersection.
  - (3) On a crosswalk.
  - (4) At anyplace where official sign prohibits stopping.
- B. Stand or park a vehicle:
  - (1) In front of a public or private driveway.
  - (2) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.

- (3) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.
- (4) Within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign or traffic-control signal located at the site of a roadway.

### **§3-104. Penalty for Violation.**

1. If the owner or operator of any bicycle shall violate any of the provisions of this Part, such bicycle may be taken and impounded by the Police Department of the Borough of Philipsburg and so held for a period not exceeding 15 days, to be determined by the police.
2. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues or each Section of this Part which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.
