Plans for 2022

Why? We have a very important meeting for all members.

What Meeting?

It is the annual planning meeting.



January marks the month when LCHA plans its year of events. Yes, we try to *plan* all the events of the year in one meeting:

- Thursday
- January 20
- 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM (we have finished earlier than that on several occasions)
- McKee 4H Building, The Ranch

If you cannot attend the meeting in person, you can attend via Zoom. However, you may not be able to hear all the discussions, or see body language during discussions. You may also not be able to see all the calendars or other visuals.

However, it is very important that you attend this meeting.

Here are some of the things we discuss in a planning meeting

Fixed Dates

Some dates are automatic. For instance,

- Our bylaws require that LCHA have an **annual meeting** in June. We typically have the annual meeting on the third Saturday of June. (Lately, because of Covid and other factors, we have moved this meeting to October.)

Dates

- In September, October, November, January, February, March, April, and May, we have **program meetings** on the first Thursday of the month (unless the first Thursday is not feasible).
- For several years, we have participated in **National Trails Day** (the first Saturday in June) by scheduling a **trail maintenance** trip on that day.
- **Poker Ride** – This is our biggest fund raiser of the year, and it deserves our careful consideration when scheduling events.
- For many years, we have scheduled **Christmas Caroling on Horseback** in Berthoud to coincide with Berthoud’s Christmas Days. The Christmas

Caroling on Horseback usually occurs on the first Saturday in December.

Calendars in hand, we determine the exact dates for each of these events, and then we set the events for those dates.

Other Events

With the fixed-date events set, we then plan other events.

Evacuation team training – We also schedule Spring training sessions for the large animal evacuation teams to maintain a high level of readiness and skill necessary to make effective and safe evacuations.

Trail maintenance – We set certain dates for trail maintenance or trail building trips, spacing them across the late Spring, Summer, and early Fall.

Trail rides – Trail ride leaders list dates and trails on which they would like to lead rides. We try to schedule at least one club ride per month – frequently more than one per month. *Note: We do NOT schedule trail rides on the same dates as trail maintenance trips.*

Fun days – a Christmas party and other events also make it to the calendar at the planning meeting.

LCHA is a very active group. It is an all-volunteer group. It depends on **your** ideas and **your** help to bring all our ideas to fruition, and to meet our mission: Advocacy, Community, and Education.



If you are a member of LCHA, come to the planning meeting.

- If you have a question, an idea, or a suggestion for an event you would like, bring it to the meeting.
- If you have an idea for a program, bring it to the planning meeting. We will be glad to hear it, consider it, and probably include it in the list of programs for the year.

So come to the planning meeting, and bring your ideas and wishes.



FYI: E-Group

DID YOU KNOW?

Larimer County Horseman's Association (LCHA) has an e-group. It is an email group that offers a good way to exchange information with other LCHA members. It serves **ALL** LCHA members who want to receive information or post information.



What Kind of Information

The e-group is for exchanging information you want, or information you have and want others to know about.

You can ask questions. For example, where can I find a new bridle for my horse? Where is Lion Gulch trail? Who has some hay for sale?

You can post messages. For example, you can post an impromptu ride, and ask if anyone would like to join you. You can describe a very nice ride you have just taken, and recommend the trail or some other factor that made it a good experience.

Note: **Information on the e-group must be related to horses or the horse industry.** For example, it is OK to post information about Fleet of Angels, but not about politics, either for or against.

How Do I Use the LCHA E-Group?

If you are an LCHA member, and if you have email, you can receive e-group messages and you can post messages on the e-group. The e-group address is ***lchamember@googlegroups.com***.

Your message will go to LCHA members only. Likewise, only LCHA members may use it. If you use the e-group, any LCHA member can respond.

You will receive NO SPAM.

Remember, ALL LCHA members will receive messages on the e-group. If you want to send something to a specific person or just a few people, you need to send it to their email address.

Editor's Note: The purpose of this article is to encourage use of the e-group. In particular, members can use the e-group more often. For instance, use it to post impromptu rides. The more often we ride together, the more often we can engage other LCHA members. If we invite non-members to ride with us, we can increase LCHA exposure to other equestrians who might want to join us.

Sign Up for Your Event

Please! Please! Please! Sign up for events in advance (especially events that involve riding):

- For any weekend ride, sign up by the end of Thursday before the ride.
- For any week day ride, sign up at least two days in advance.
- For some events, earlier sign-up may be required.

No matter how you do it, sign up.

Why?

If we need to cancel an event, your ride leader can get in touch with you to let you know before you drive to the location. You won't use gasoline or time waiting for an event that isn't going to happen. Also, your event leader needs to know if anyone is coming: If no one signs up, the leader may cancel or reschedule the event. And, if you have any special concerns or circumstances (for example, it is your horse's first ride with a group), your leader can plan to deal with the situation in the best possible way.

Limit

What's the Deal with "Limit"?

Wilderness areas, properties owned by the city of Fort Collins, and Red Mountain Open Space have a "12-heartbeat rule": a group cannot include more than 12 heartbeats when using trails in these areas. When riding our horses, the rule limits our groups to 6 riders (plus 6 horses with hearts) to meet the 12-heartbeat rule.

However, if we have significantly more than 6 riders who want to ride, we can split them into 2 or more groups, each group including 6 riders (1 ride leader plus 5 others). The second group must leave the trail head 20 to 25 minutes after the first so that they do not merge with the first group.

When "Limit" is 4 horse trailers, it means that the parking space can hold only 4 horse trailers (tightly packed). However, we encourage "trailer pooling" if more than 4 people want to go on the ride.

Actually, we encourage "trailer pooling" for any ride. The benefits are obvious.

Lunch?

For all rides except the Christmas Caroling on Horseback, bring your lunch (unless your ride leader tells you otherwise). You will have lunch somewhere on the trail.

LCHA Educational Programs

LCHA offers a program meeting on the First Thursday of each month, except June, July, August and December. All members are invited, and the public is invited, to any program meeting. We now meet either in person at the McKee 4H Building at The Ranch, or – for those who cannot make it to a meeting in person – all meetings are also in Zoom. Before each educational meeting the LCHA newsletter, *LCHA Roundup*, will publish program details



