

Important Update for Copper Lakes Residents

A letter published by the HOA Attorney and posted on this site confirms that for members to call a **Special Meeting of the Members**, a petition must be submitted. This petition must include the specific purpose of the meeting and be signed by at least **10% of the community members** before being presented to **Inframark and the Board**.

Currently, many of your neighbors are leading a **petition drive** to collect the necessary signatures to hold this Special Meeting.

In the coming weeks, you may be approached by a neighbor asking you to sign the petition. Signing does not indicate a vote on any issue—it simply ensures that members have the opportunity to convene and **vote on important bylaw changes** at the Special Meeting.

Why This Matters:

- The Board **secretly changed** the bylaws to grant themselves the power to **fire a duly elected director** without member input. They exercised this new power to remove a well-respected director whom the community had voted into office.
- The Board **unilaterally restricted voting methods**. For over **30 years**, members could vote using multiple methods, including in person. The new bylaw changes **forces all voting** to be conducted through Inframark electronic system, which requires members to have an email on file. Many members **do not have a registered email** or may not wish to provide one, limiting their ability to participate.

The goal of this petition and Special Meeting is to **restore fair and transparent voting rights** by reinstating multiple voting methods and reversing the Board's unilateral bylaw changes.

By signing the petition, you are simply helping to **ensure that the community has a say** in how its HOA operates.
