

TEAM FOCUS - UNDER 12S

The HDC U12s kicked off their season with a tough 3–1 defeat to Shrewsbury Up and Comers. It was a challenging start, but one that sparked a remarkable turnaround. Since that opening setback, the team has gone on a six-game winning streak, delivering performances full of character, quality, and growing confidence.

Their first win came in dramatic fashion against Kidderminster Harriers. After falling 2–0 behind inside the first eight minutes, the boys responded with relentless pressure and some of their best football to date. With 15 shots on goal, only a Man of the Match performance from the opposition keeper kept the scoreline down. Eventually, the team broke through and secured a 5–2 victory — a true display of resilience and maturity.

Next came a dominant 9–0 win over Alvechurch. From start to finish, the team was clinical, dispatching chances with ease. While there were moments where ball movement could have been sharper, the overall performance was commanding and full of promise.

Against Pegasus, the squad delivered a superb 6–0 win. The first half was tight, but belief in their style paid off in the second. One standout moment was an 11-pass move from goal kick to tap-in - a goal that would be celebrated at any level of the game. It was a performance full of professionalism, assurance, and energy.

The Coldlands Colts fixture was a true game of two halves. After a tight opening period, the boys came out flying in the second half. A goal in the first minute set the tone, and the team delivered 9 goals in just 30 minutes of free-flowing football. Momentum continued to build.

In the local derby against Shrewsbury Town South, the U12s produced a masterclass. After going behind early, they responded with 57 minutes of pure quality. Confident defending, relentless pressing, and fluid attacking play led to a 5–1 win. Some of the one-touch football was a joy to watch — arguably their most complete display of the season. Their most recent outing saw them travel early to Stratford Town for a 9:30 kick-off. Despite the uneven surface, the boys adapted quickly and dominated from the first whistle. Going in at half-time 3–0 up, the message was clear: keep playing the right way and aim for a clean sheet. That's exactly what they delivered, finishing with an 8–0 win and a performance full of discipline and team spirit.

This season, the HDC U12s are under the expert guidance of Coach Jon, who brings a wealth of experience and pedigree to the Development Centre. Having enjoyed a successful professional and semi-professional playing career, Jon transitioned into coaching through the United in the Community programme — a pathway that has shaped his philosophy and approach to youth development. Jon joins HDC from Pegasus Juniors, where he led a highly successful junior side. His coaching journey has been influenced by some of the most respected names in English football, including Keith Downing, former England U20 manager and current Derby County assistant, and Dick Bate, the late former England Women's coach and renowned FA educator. Their mentorship has helped Jon develop a coaching style that balances technical excellence with character-building — a perfect fit for the U12s.
