Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 8:57 a.m.

- Approval of minutes from last meeting: There were no minutes from last month as there was no meeting in September.
- *Treasurer's Report*: Account has \$9,823.02 with an outstanding check for \$157.88.
- Open issues/Old Business:
- Haunted Canyon 3D Night Shoot: Debbie spoke about the upcoming shoot that is scheduled for October 30, 2021. Registration starts at 4:00pm 5:30pm. The shoot starts at Dusk with a 'shotgun start'. This shoot will have a kid-centric, Halloween theme. There will be novelty targets on the lighted range for both kids and adults, and a costume contest for kids 12 and under. \$50 Visa gift cards will be given out for the Scariest costume and for the Most Original costume. Volunteers are needed to help run concession stand, registration and Pot Shot contest. Please see Debbie if you can help.
- Membership Drive: Rick reminded everyone to renew their memberships before December, so your membership won't lapse.
 Only members in good standing are allowed to vote in the upcoming elections.
- Youth Archery: Keith updated everyone on the status of the youth group. The board of directors must update the bylaws to include how the youth group will be run in order to establish a secondary checking account for the group. Monies from this checking account will be used to purchase items needed for the youth group to function such as targets, bows, strings, etc. Rick suggested that the club should commit \$500 for the youth group checking account. Zack moved that the club set aside \$500 for the youth group checking account. Josh seconded the motion. Motion PASSED.
- Elections: Rick reminded everyone that elections are scheduled for the December 4th meeting. If you are interested in running for office, or would like to nominate someone to an office, *please do so as soon as possible!* Notify either Rick or Debbie with the name of the nominee and for what office that nominee will be running for BEFORE the December meeting.
- New Business:
- Bathroom repairs needed: Keith reported that all the toilets need
 to have the valves replaced. The water at the range is so hard that
 scale deposits prevent moving parts from working. The sink in the

ladies' room also needs to be shored up with $2 \times 4s$ and the faucet needs to be tightened down.

- Items from the floor:
- Rick informed the club that the SWBH Board of Directors are meeting on Thursday, Oct. 7th to update the club bylaws to reflect the addition of a youth group and how that group will be organized, as well as any other items that may need to be updated. The last update was in 2004.
- Aileen Toler asked if the club could set up a 20-meter target on the north part of the range for the recurve bow shooters. Rick said we could do that right after the meeting.
- Adjournment: A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Debbie; motion seconded by Zach. Motion PASSED. The meeting was adjourned at 9:22 a.m.

Featured Recipe:

Chef John's Orange Duck

This is one of those classic dishes that somehow became a cliche, and people stopped making it for fear of looking un-cool, which is too bad, since it's really good. This is traditionally done with a whole roasted duck, but by using breasts we get pretty much the same results in a lot less time.

By Chef John

Prep: 15 mins Cook: 20 mins Additional: 15 mins Total: 50 mins Servings: 2

Ingredients

- 2 duck breasts
- Salt to taste
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons orange liqueur (such as Grand Marnier®)
- 1 tablespoon sherry vinegar
- 1 tablespoon Seville orange marmalade, or more to taste
- 2 teaspoons grated orange zest



- 1 pinch cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon reserved duck fat
- 1 teaspoon all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon butter

Directions

Step 1

Score duck skin almost all the way through the skin and fat each way on the diagonal in a crosshatch pattern. Generously season with salt and rub salt into each breast. Let rest, skin-side up, at room temperature, for 15 minutes.

Step 2

Whisk chicken broth, orange liqueur, sherry vinegar, orange marmalade, orange zest, and cayenne pepper together in a small bowl.

Step 3

Pat duck breasts dry with paper towels. Re-season skin-side of duck breasts with salt.

• Step 4

Heat duck fat in a heavy skillet over medium heat for 2 minutes. Place duck in skillet, skin-side down, and cook for 6 minutes. Flip duck breasts and cook until they start to firm and are reddish-pink and juicy in the center, about 4 minutes more. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read 140 degrees F (60 degrees C). Transfer breasts to a plate to rest. Pour any rendered duck fat into a glass jar.

Step 5

Return skillet to medium heat and whisk flour into pan; cook and stir until flour is completely incorporated, about 1 minute. Pour orange mixture into skillet; bring to a boil. Cook until sauce thickens and is reduced, 3 to 5 minutes. Reduce heat to low. When orange mixture stops bubbling, add butter; stir until butter is completely melted and incorporated into the sauce, about 1 minute. Season with salt to taste.

Step 6

Slice duck breasts across the grain, arrange on a plate, and spoon orange sauce over the top.

Cook's Note:

You can substitute vegetable oil for the duck fat.


