Meeting Minutes

Date: December 4, 2022

Time: 9:00 a.m.

- I. Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 9:00am.
- II. Approval of minutes from last meeting: Debbie moved that the minutes from the November 6th meeting be approved; Bryon seconded the motion. Motion Passed.
- *III. Treasurer's Report:* There is \$5,384.19 available in the checking, however, there is an outstanding bill for electricity from Adair Park for \$101.47.
- IV. Open issues/Old Business:
 - a. Swamp Gobbler Turkey Shoot: There were a total of 22 registered participants this year. Discussion ensued as to whether or not we should continue or discontinue this event, as we have lost money on this shoot for the past two years. Rick moved that Southwest Bowhunters discontinue the Turkey Shoot; Kelvin seconded the motion. Motion Passed.
 - b. Work Party on December 3rd: Approximately 15 people participated in the range work party on Saturday, and another 4 participated on Wednesday, Nov. 30th. Several projects were completed in preparation for the upcoming Charity Shoot on Dec. 10th & 11th and Walk the Trail Shoot on Feb. 18th & 19th. A big shout-out to everyone who participated!
 - V. New Business:

- a. Keith suggested that people who help at events (i.e.: Charity Shoot, Walk the Trail, etc.) get to shoot for free at the following Sunday Fun Shoot. Debbie moved that SWBH allow those who help with events to shoot for free at the following Sunday Fun Shoot; Gene seconded the motion. Motion Passed.
- b. New Chronograph: Some members have complained that the present chronograph is not consistent in its readings and recommended that the club replace it with a new one. Keith pointed out that the "Low Battery" alert was on the last time he had it out and suggested that we change the battery on the existing chronograph and test it before we spend money on a new one. This item will be readdressed at the January meeting if the battery doesn't fix the problem.

VI. Items from the floor:

- a. Keith suggested that we add two new board members to bring the total up to five. In the old Bylaws, the club had four board members, one of whom has moved away. However, that proved to be problematic when there was a tie during a vote. He recommended David Wetherholt and Bryon Green be considered for those positions at the January meeting.
- b. Rick spoke about volunteerism and how some members volunteer a lot more than others. One member in particular puts an enormous amount of energy into volunteering for the club: Butch Lacey. Rick suggested that Butch be granted a Lifetime Membership as a reward for all he does for the club. Rick moved that the club award a Lifetime Membership to Butch Lacey; motion seconded by Gene. Motion Passed.

From the Hunter's Kitchen:

Elk Stuffed Mushrooms

If you are throwing a party or attending a get-together with friends and family, you shouldn't underestimate the importance of the Hors d'oeuvre. These bite sized finger foods are typically served before the main course and are always a crowd pleaser, keeping your guests



pleaser, keeping your guests sustained until the main dish is ready to be served.

A popular Hors d'oeuvre is the stuffed mushroom which is an elegant classic appetizer filled with rich and warm ingredients. My crowdpleaser recipe combines ground elk seasoned with perfumy fennel, breadcrumbs and Gruyère which is a sweet and salty cheese. Stuff each individual buttery mushroom cap with a generous amount of filling, bake until the tops are golden brown and watch how fast they disappear when served.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb ground elk
- 20-24 white button mushrooms
- 1 sm onion, chopped
- ½ cup breadcrumbs
- ½ cup Gruyère cheese
- 2 tsp fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 tsp ground fennel
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- ½ tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp olive oil
- 2 tbsp unsalted butter, melted

PREPARATION

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 2. Remove the mushroom stems and brush the mushroom caps to remove any dirt. Set mushrooms aside.
- 3. Heat a skillet over medium heat and add the olive oil, ground elk, onions, fennel, garlic powder and salt. Cook until the meat is browned, and the onion have softened about 5 minutes. Add the chopped parsley, remove from heat and let cool slightly.

4. In a large bowl, mix together the elk meat, breadcrumbs and Gruyère cheese. Take each mushroom cap and dip the stem side in melted butter, then stuff with filling. Set the mushrooms stem side up on a sheet pan and bake for 18 to 20 minutes.
