## General Meeting Minutes

**Date: September 15, 2024**

**Time: 9:00 a.m.**

**Type of Meeting:** General Members

- I. Call to order:** The meeting was called to order at 9:01am by President Fritz Holtz.
- II. Approval of minutes from last meeting:** Motion to accept the minutes as written was made by Scott Covey; seconded by Bryon Green. Motion passed.
- III. Treasurer's Report:** Kelvin reported that we have \$7,843.01 in the main account; \$470.70 in the JOAD account, for a total of \$8,313.71.
- IV. Open issues/Old Business:**
  - a) Range Security** – Scott reported that he will set up a day that Nick can bring a forklift to move the concrete barricades and the large timbers that were donated by the County. Once these are in position,

the problem of people driving around the barricades should be alleviated.

- b) **Back-to-Back Shoots** – Fritz reminded everyone that the High Noon on the Gila is on the 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> of February, and Walk The Trail is the very next weekend, February 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup>. We will only need four (4) trails for High Noon on the Gila, and we can leave most of the targets up as Scott will be spending the week in between at the range in his trailer. We will be needing many volunteers to help with registration, concessions, raffles, and running novelty shoots, so please consider helping in any way you can!
- c) **Bathrooms Update** – Gump stated that he could probably get some new toilets and a urinal donated, and he and Scotty plan on gutting the old bathrooms and redo the plumbing, drywall and installation of the fixtures. Scott believes we can do the whole job for under \$1,000. He will report back next meeting.
- d) **Haunted Canyon Shoot:** Debbie reminded everyone that the Haunted Canyon 3D Night Shoot is on Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup>. Online registration is now open. The shoot will consist of 20 targets including some novelty targets, as well as the Costume Contest for kids 12 and under. Desi is going to be selling ‘Walking Tacos’ in addition to the Hot Dogs & Chili Dogs from the concession stand.

## ***V. New Business:***

- a) **Work Party** – Scott spoke about the need to have a work day before the December ‘Hunt for Charity’ shoot, and asked the members for input as to what date(s) would work. It was suggested that November 2<sup>nd</sup> would work for most people, and more of our Snowbird friends will have arrived by then.
- b) **SWBH “Gold Card** – Fritz and Scotty reported on a concept that was brought up at the Board meeting about creating a new level of membership - The Gold Card - for an annual fee of \$200. This will cover membership dues, and ALL Sunday Fun Shoots for the year, January 1 – December 31. This works out to an annual savings of approx. \$100 if you were to shoot all the Sunday Fun Shoots during the year. Bryon made a motion to create this new membership level; Gene seconded the motion. Motion passed.

## ***VI. Items from the floor:***

- a) **Targets** – Butch reported that all the targets we ordered in the spring have arrived and been inventoried
- b) **Shirts** – Scott is looking into making an order for shirts and hats. He states that the company he uses can turn orders around in about a week. Scott will have numbers for the next meeting, at which time the club can discuss and vote on funding.

**VII. Adjournment:** Fritz asked if there was any further business to discuss. Gump moved that we adjourn the meeting; Scott seconded the motion. Motion passed. Meeting was adjourned at 9:20am.

Last year was one of the most successful seasons for SWBH ever. For the first time, we hosted the 3rd leg of the AZ 3D Championship Series, as well as all our regular shoots. Thanks to these successful shoots, the club was able to purchase several new targets and make improvements to the range.

This year – sadly - the AZ 3D Championship Series is no more. However, thanks to the efforts of our Shoots Committee and the committee members of three other archery clubs in Tucson and Phoenix, the new **Southwest 3D Championship Series** was born. The Series will consist of the following shoots:

- Southwest Bowhunters "High Noon on the Gila" – Feb. 8 (& 9)
- Huachuca Mountain Archers & Bowhunters "Fort Huachuca Challenge" – March 1 & 2
- Desert Archers "Rumble in the Rocks" – March 29 & 30
- Stick Snipers "Stick Snipers' Classic" – April 26 (& 27)

This year, there are four legs to The Series, and shooters must compete in at least three of the four legs to be eligible for the Buckle. This will

allow those of us hosting a shoot a chance to be in the running for The Series grand prize.

Walk The Trail will still be held on the third weekend of February, so we will be asking all our members for help in all aspects of both shoots; everything from set up to tear down, concessions, running novelty shoots, and more. We are also looking for donations of items for our raffles for both the High Noon on the Gila and Walk The Trail shoots.

Our first shoot of the season will be the Haunted Canyon 3D Night Shoot. As usual, we will be having a costume contest for the kids 12 and under with prizes for the Scariest, Cutest, and Most Original costumes. The shoot will consist of 20 targets set up in the Haunted Canyon, and for those brave enough, on-site dry camping will be available. (See website for more details.)

## *From the Hunter's Kitchen:*

### PEPPERED DOVE BREAST

★★★★★ 5 from 13 votes

While I do this with doves, there's no reason you can't use the breasts off any bird from grouse size on down. Non hunters would want to use quail or Cornish game hen breasts.

**COURSE:** APPETIZER,  
LUNCH, MAIN COURSE  
**CUISINE:** FRENCH  
**SERVINGS:** 4 SERVINGS  
**PREP TIME:** 20 MINUTES  
**COOK TIME:** 15 MINUTES  
**TOTAL  
TIME:** 35 MINUTES



## INGREDIENTS

- 1 pound dove breasts, from about 16 birds
- Salt
- 4 tablespoons butter, divided
- 1 shallot, minced
- 1/3 cup brandy, or sherry or Madeira or Marsala
- 1/2 cup low sodium stock, or glace de viande
- 1 tablespoon coarsely ground black pepper
- 1 or 2 tablespoons green peppercorns
- 1/4 cup heavy cream

## INSTRUCTIONS

- Salt the dove breasts well and keep them in the fridge until the last minute. Heat up 3 tablespoons of the butter in the pan over medium-high heat.
- When it's hot, sear the dove breasts for 2 minutes, only on one side. Move them to a plate to rest while you make the sauce.
- Add the minced shallot to the pan and sauté until soft and slightly browned, about 3 minutes. Add the brandy and use a wooden spoon to scrape up any browned bits. Let this boil 1 minute.
- Pour in the stock, black pepper and green peppercorns, and boil it all furiously until cooked down by half, about 2 minutes.
- Return the dove breasts, uncooked sides down, to the pan and swirl in the cream. As soon as the cream starts bubbling, drop the heat to low. Swirl it all to combine. Add the final tablespoon of butter to the center of the pan and swirl until it melts and combines with the sauce. Serve with bread or potatoes.

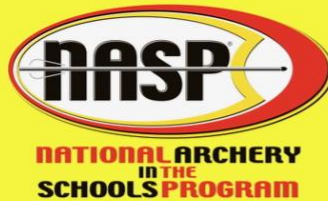




## Volunteers Are Always Welcome
