# **Renew Your Membership Today!**

Each January, SWBH members need to renew their membership dues, both individual and family. While that date has come and gone, it's still not too late to renew.

Club membership dues allow the SWBH club to make improvements to our archery range at Adair Park. Our latest project is a remodel of the concession stand, replacing, repairing and painting drywall, updating lighting fixtures and electrical panels, repairing and replacing cupboards, and even updating the refrigeration



system. This is in addition to the day-to-day upkeep of the bales and targets, both paper and 3D.

## Weather Doesn't Dampen Walk The Trails 2019 Shoot

The 2019 Walk The Trails 3D Shoot is in the books, and even though the weather was threating to the west of the mountains, we once again had great event. Seventy-seven registered shooters partook of our three fun, yet challenging, courses; the Canyon Course, East River Course and West River Course.

The object of the event is to find all of the targets, shoot from where you first see them, and score as best as you can. However, if you should miss

finding a target, you cannot backtrack to take a shot. Should this happen, the shooter must take a zero for that target. In addition, rangefinders are not allowed.

The Canyon Course with 30 targets, at first glance, seems to be pretty easy. Targets are usually easy to spot, however, upon closer inspection, there are some *very* technical shots. Should a shooter miss a target and

hit a branch or rock, that arrow is usually destroyed. There were several casualties this year!

The two River Courses with 15 targets each, more closely simulates real hunting scenarios. Participants must walk

slowly down the trail while looking left and right at every opening in the brush, as there may be a target lurking deep in the brush. Many targets are very well hidden, and again, there are some very technical shots that many times result in lost or broken arrows. As mentioned earlier, should you miss seeing a target and walk past it, you cannot backtrack to take the shot.

This year, we added several new targets including a hanging bat, a couple of pheasants, and several smaller 3D animals. You just never know what might be found as you Walk The Trails!
