# SWBH 1st Annual Turkey Shoot

With crisp fall mornings and the promise of the holidays just around the corner; can you think of a better time for an archery tournament?

On November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019, SWBH held their first ever “Turkey Shoot”. The course consisted of 28 3D targets on the Canyon Course and one novelty target: The Gila River Swamp Gobbler!

On November 23<sup>rd</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup>, two archery students from SWBH competed at the Ben Avery Shooting Park Archery Indoor Range in Phoenix in an ‘unconventional’ competition call the Lord of the Bales Combined Recurve/Compound Shoot. The shoot is unconventional in that everyone is lumped into one category no matter what gender, age or shooting style. Liz Goff and Pheobe Desposito competed by shooting recurve bows. Many of the competitors have been shooting for many years. While neither Liz or Pheobe made it to the finals, they both placed in the top 15: Liz Goff placed 9<sup>th</sup>, and Pheobe Desposito placed 11<sup>th</sup> overall. Pheobe has only been shooting for about two years, while Liz has only been shooting for six months - and this was Liz’s first ever tournament!
