Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 9:02 a.m.

Approval of minutes from last meeting: Fritz moved that the minutes from the March meeting be approved; Austin seconded the motion. Motion Passed.

Treasurer's Report: Main account has \$4,229.76; Youth account has \$269.92.

Open issues/Old Business:

- a) ***High Noon on the Gila*** – Fritz reminded everyone that we need volunteers for this event. We also need sponsors to either donate product or money. Debbie mentioned that signups are lagging and encouraged members to sign up for our leg of the Southwest 3D Championship Series as well as the other legs. We need to support our sister clubs!
- b) ***Walk The Trail*** – Sponsors / volunteers are needed for the shoot. Remember, this is our main fundraiser for the year! The club needs donations of product for the raffle; the club will again spend \$250 on prizes to supplement the donations.
- c) ***Kitchen Cabinets*** – Scotty reported that he was able to pick up new cabinets for the kitchen for \$150. They are delivered and will be permanently installed sometime after the High Noon on the Gila event.
- d) ***Shirts/Sticker*** – The club still has some SWBH window stickers, but needs to order some more shirts in XL, XXL, and 3XL. In addition, the online ordering site will be re-opened next week for a limited time for those who want to pre-order shirts and/or sweatshirts.
- e) ***Bow Raffle*** – Sprague's has agreed to selling us a Matthew's Lift for \$759, out the door (MSRP for that bow is \$1439). There will be only 250 tickets printed; the drawing will be held when all tickets are sold.
- f) ***Hunt for Charity*** – Kelvin reported that he delivered the \$250 donation to Amberly's House.
- g) ***Membership Renewals*** – Debbie reminded everyone that memberships from last year are expired and must be renewed. The gate combination has been changed; new combo will be on your 2026 membership card.

New Business:

- a) **40th Anniversary Shirts** – This is SWBH’s 40th anniversary. We are looking for appropriate artwork for commemorative shirts. If you have ideas for the design, please submit them to one of the board members before the February meeting.
- b) **Next Meeting Date Conflict** – Since the first Sunday in February is February 1st, and the High Noon on the Gila shoot is still going on, the Board has decided to reschedule the next meeting for the following Sunday, February 8th.

Items from the floor:

- a) **This Month’s Attendance Drawing:** The monthly attendance prize was \$30. Juana Urbina’s name was drawn; however, she was not in attendance. Therefore, the pot will roll over to next month and increase to \$35. Remember, you must be in attendance to win!

Adjournment: Fritz asked if there were any further items from the floor and called for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion was made by Austin; seconded by Gump. Motion Passed. The meeting was adjourned at 9:15am.

From the Hunter's Kitchen:

VENISON PASTA FAGIOLI

Serves 6 to 8.

Ingredients:

- 8 oz ditalini pasta
- 1 to 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, diced
- 1 cup diced carrot
- 1 cup diced celery
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 lb. ground venison
- 1 tbsp Italian seasoning
- ½ tsp crushed red pepper flakes, plus more for serving (optional)
- 1 tsp salt
- ½ tsp black pepper



- 3 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 15 oz can cannellini beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 15 oz can kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 15 oz can tomato sauce
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 1 cup reserved pasta water
- Grated Parmesan cheese, for serving (optional, omit for dairy free)

Instructions:

1. Cook the ditalini according to the package directions until al dente, about 10 minutes. Before you drain the pasta, reserve about 1 cup of the pasta water to add to the dish if needed
2. Meanwhile, warm the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, carrot and celery and cook for 5 minutes longer. Add the garlic and venison and cook, stirring occasionally, until the venison is browned, about 8 minutes.
3. Add the Italian seasoning, red pepper flakes (if using, salt, pepper and the red wine vinegar and cook for 2 minutes longer. Add the beans, tomato sauce and chicken broth. Bring the mixture to a boil, lower the heat and simmer for 20 minutes.
4. Add the cooked pasta and stir to incorporate. If the mixture is looking a little thick, add some of the reserved pasta water and let it simmer for about 5 minutes to incorporate.
5. Serve while hot in a big bowl with plenty of Parmesan cheese and red pepper flakes, if desired.

Notes:

- This dish pairs well with crusty bread or a side side salad for a complete meal.
- Leftovers can be stored in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 3 days.

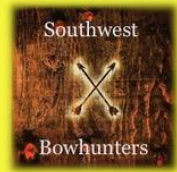


Volunteers Are Always Welcome

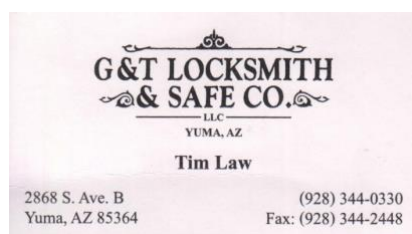
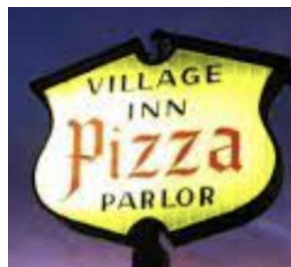
