# General Meeting Minutes

Date: March 9, 2025

Time: 9:00 a.m.

Type of Meeting: General Monthly Meeting

*Call to order:* Fritz Hoff called the meeting to order at 9:05am.

*I. Treasurer's Report:* There is \$18,500.99 in the General Account; \$453.72 in the youth account. Total for both accounts: \$18,954.71. We owe \$529.13 for our ½ share of the Southwest 3D Championship Series buckles. This will be paid on Monday.

#### II. Old Business:

- A) Recap of recent shoots Debbie
  - 1) High Noon on the Gila: We made \$1,896.50 from online registrations (after Stride Events took their cut). We made another \$225 on walk up Registrations, and ~\$700 on food.

Total Registrations: \$3,038.50 Food: \$700.00 Total: \$3,738.50

2) Walk The Trail: Online registrations: \$602 (registrations, mulligans, doe tags and dinners); Walk-up registrations: \$2,872.00 (registrations, mulligans, doe tags and dinners). Registrations total: \$3,474.00.

Expenses: \$3,576.47. Sales & Donations: \$6,805.00. Net: \$3,228.53

#### **TOTAL FOR BOTH SHOOTS: \$10,441.03**

- B) Thank You Fritz thanked everyone for the time and effort they all put in to make this season such a success. This was the most successful tournament season that SWBH club has ever had. He stressed how this wouldn't have been possible without our volunteers.
- C) Bathroom Update Fritz: The board has decided to pay someone to complete the plumbing and drywall in the restrooms. Gump is going to acquire a new urinal for the men's room.
- *D)* Carpet Butts Kelvin / Fritz: Kelvin is going to start making more target butts from carpet remnants. We have a source for the carpet but needs volunteers to help cut out the pieces and press them together. Fritz suggested that we pick a date to have a work party to build the butts, and March 29<sup>th</sup> was selected.

#### III. New business:

- A) Hoot Shoot Debbie reminded everyone that the Hoot Shoot 3D Night Fun Shoot is coming up on April 26<sup>th</sup>. Registration is available online or in person starting at 4:30pm. Shoot begins at 7:30pm. Flyers are available online with more information.
- **B)** New River Trail Nicholas Muñoz asked the club if they would be interested in developing a new trail in the river bottom. It would take a work party and some loaned equipment to accomplish this. Discussion followed. Bryon moved that we develop another river trail; Seconded by Fritz. Motion passed.
- C) Sunday Funday Shoots It seems that the once-a-month field archery shoots aren't quite as popular as expected, but we don't want to discontinue them completely. Kelvin proposed that we have a field archery shoot once every two months. If enough members want to continue the field archery shoots, they will be given access to the targets and can set them up on the course. It was also suggested that we use the River Trail(s) for one Sunday shoot per month instead of always using the Canyon Course. Bryon moved that we use the River Trail once a month for our Sunday shoots; Zach seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- D) Broadhead Targets Fritz informed the club the Rinehart has several blemished broadhead-rated buck targets available for sale at a discounted price. He pointed out that these targets could be used to tune broadhead arrows, would only be available to club members and only in the weeks before deer hunting season starts. He also stated that there are a few more inserts needed for the targets for next year. Bryon moved that the club authorize up to \$2,500 to purchase the broadhead targets and new inserts for existing targets; Austin seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- E) Board vacancy Fritz reported that David Wetherholt has resigned as Vice President due to personal reasons. We need to fill that position ASAP. Fritz nominated Bryon Green for Vice President. No other nominations were put forth. A voice vote was called for; the vote was unanimous. Bryon Green is now the Vice President. With Bryon becoming VP, that leaves a vacancy on the Board of Directors. Fritz

nominated Nicholas Muñoz to fill the Board vacancy. No other nominations were put forth. A voice vote was called for; the vote was unanimous. Nicholas Muñoz is now on the Board of Directors.

#### IV. Items from the floor:

- A) Bryon asked if the club has a heavy drag that can be used to smooth out the River Trail pathways. Kelvin acknowledged that we do, but that it is so heavy that he doubts that the ATV will be able to drag it. The club will explore possible alternatives to using the ATV as a tow vehicle for the drag.
- **V.** Adjournment: Fritz asked if there were any other items from the floor. There were none. Bryon moved that the meeting be adjourned; Fritz seconded the motion. Motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 9:26am.

# From the Hunter's Kitchen: WILD BOAR LOIN WITH ASPARAGUS

5 from 2 votes

This recipe combines springtime veggies and a perfect meat for spring — wild boar tenderloin. The only hard part is making the sauce, and that isn't so much difficult as it is time-consuming. And the sauce can be made up to a day ahead. After that, this dish comes together very quickly. This recipe would also be good with pheasant breast, lamb, venison, or even sturgeon. A word on the medium-cooked pork. This boar had been frozen for some time, which will kill any trichinae parasites should they be present (this is a remote possibility, but better safe



than sorry). Should you have fresh pork, be sure to cook it to at least 140 degrees, which will kill the parasite; I cook mine to about 145-150 degrees, which is a blush of pink.

SERVINGS: 4 PEOPLE AUTHOR: <u>HANK SHAW</u> PREP TIME: 30 MINUTES COOK TIME: 30 MINUTES TOTAL TIME: 1 HOUR

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- □ 1 pound pork tenderloin
- □ 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- $\square$  Kosher salt
- □ 1 pound asparagus


☐ 1 tablespoon olive oil☐ 6 green garlic stalks☐ 3 green onions

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Make the sauce. Get a large pot of water to a boil, and salt it well. it should taste like the sea. Blanch the green garlics and onions, white part down hold them by the greens in the boiling water for 3-4 minutes. I suppose you could chop them in half and then blanch the two parts separately, but I have not tried this. After the white ends have been in for 3-4 minutes, toss the rest in and let it all boil for 2 minutes.
- 2. Remove and dump into a large bowl of ice water to cool. Take the veggies out and chop roughly. Put the green onions and green garlics into a food processor and buss the hell out of them, scraping down the sides from time to time. It will take a bit of doing to incorporate, but you will eventually get a bright green puree.
- 3. Now the hard part. Push the puree through a tamis or finemeshed sieve. This will take some effort. Take your time and keep at it for about 10 minutes or so, or until there are only fibers in the mesh. Save the strained puree for now.
- 4. Salt the pork pieces well and set aside. Turn on the broiler.
- 5. Using the tablespoon of olive oil, coat the asparagus well and then salt them. Put one tablespoon of butter in a saute pan set on high heat. When the butter melts, turn the heat down to medium-high.
- 6. Put the asparagus under the broiler. Saute the boar tenderloin over medium-high heat, turning to hit all sides. You are looking for medium here just a blush of pink. When the tenderloins are about done, remove the asparagus (the timing should work out.)
- 7. Pour the green onion/garlic puree into a small pot and add the other tablespoon of butter, set of medium-low heat and swirl to combine. Do not let this boil. Add salt to taste.
- 8. Let the boar rest while the sauce heats up. The second the sauce begins to bubble, turn off the heat and lay down some sauce on the plate. Top with the asparagus, and then with the tenderloin cut thinly.
