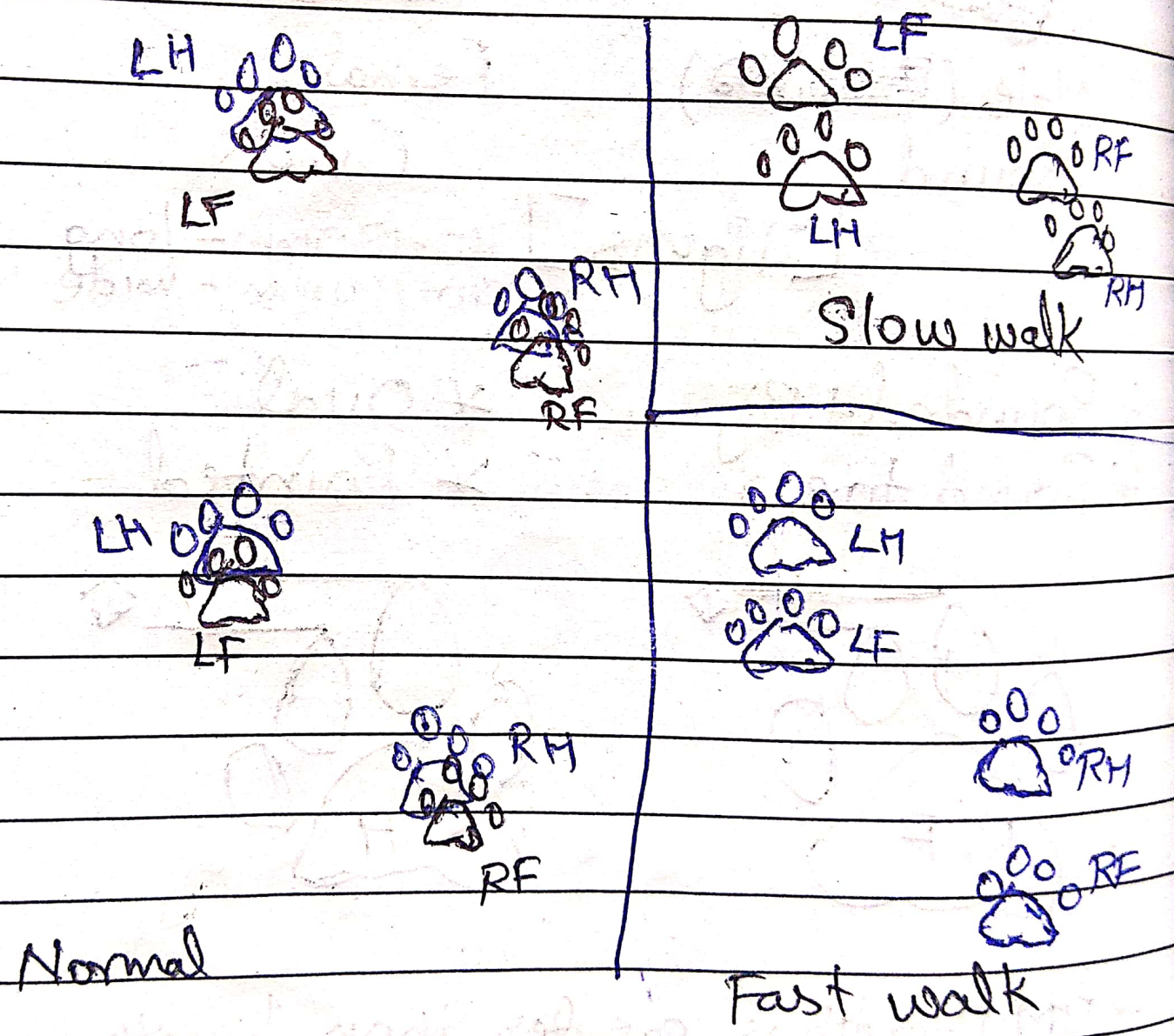
* PM Breadth is greater than length
in most males

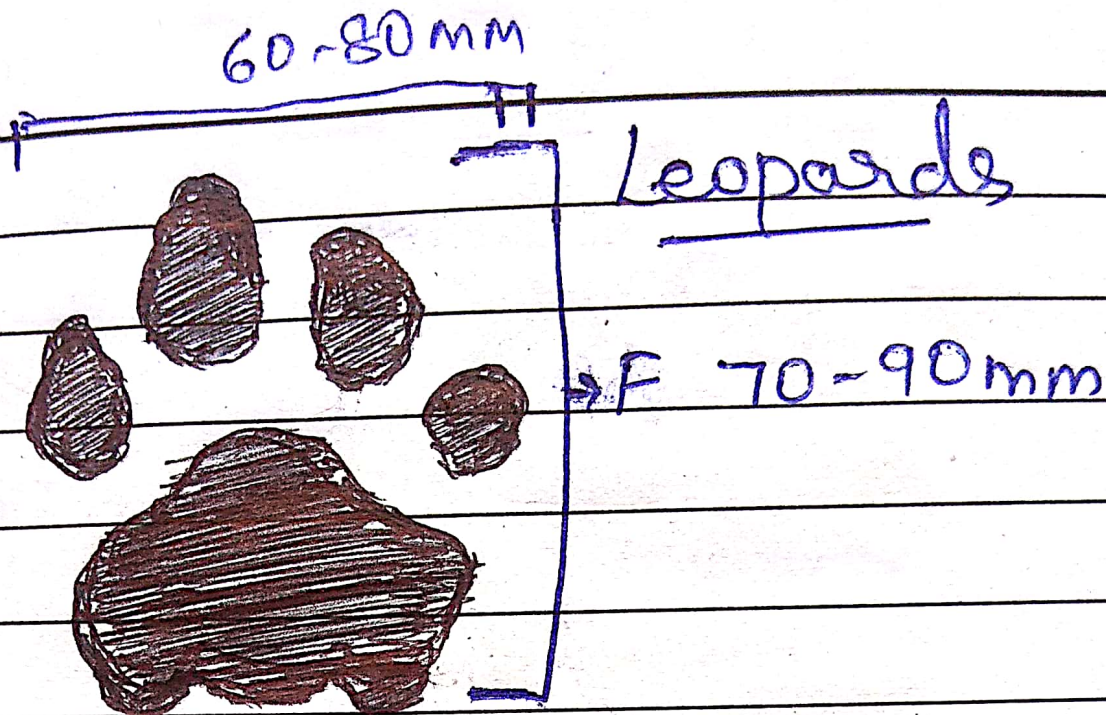

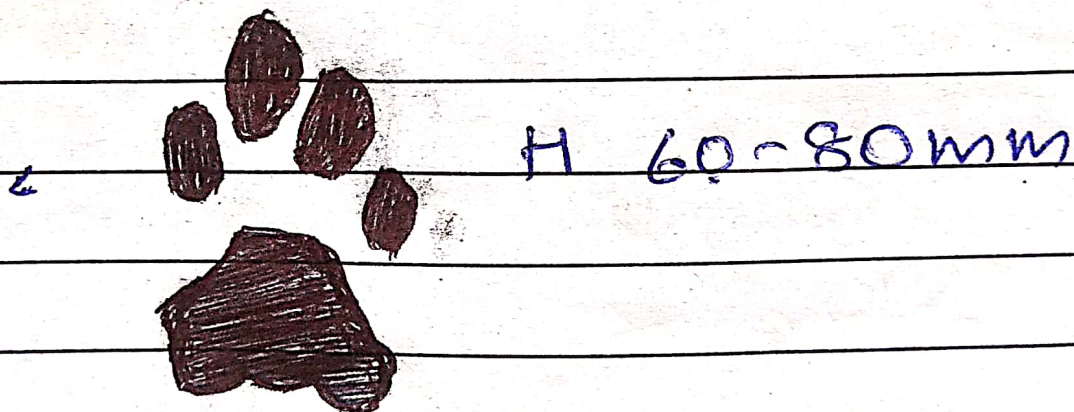
- * Male stride are greater than females

- * Gap between digits and pads can help to understand age
- * Formation of pugmarks can state behaviours eg. running, fighting, etc.

 in case of tigers.

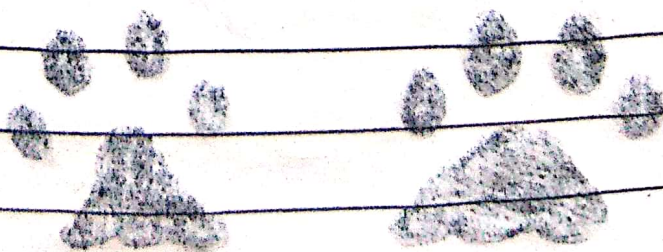


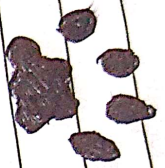


* Smaller and narrower toe

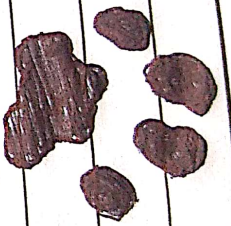


* Mistaken as tiger cub pugmarks

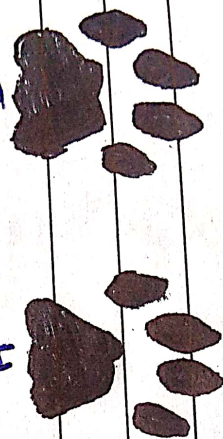

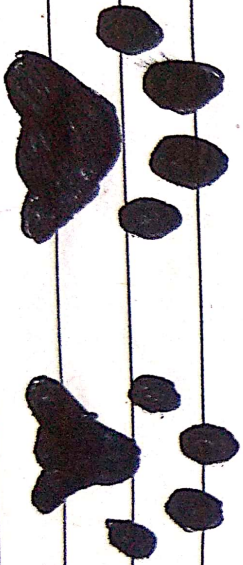
