Vote on the potential sale of HOA Common Area Land to BP&R

The electronic ballot with the question of whether the HOA should sell ~3 acres of common area land to BP&R to build a park on, was E-mailed out on Monday, the 28th, at noon. If you haven't received it yet, please check your 'spam' folder. If you still can't find it, please request that it be E-mailed again. Barking dogs

Yard Debris Bins for fire fuel collection

HOA homeowner and resident Seth Steele will be supplying a 15' bin for fire fuels and yard debris collection this season, during the FireFree days. This service will be paid for by the HOA this year. Please do not overfill the bin.

Dead and Dying Trees

Last year was the hottest, and possibly the driest, year on record. This year probably won't be much different. This means that trees that have barely survived in previous years, will be dying soon, unless they receive supplemental water. If you see your trees turning brown, especially later in the summer, water them or they will die. If they die, you will be required by the HOA and the City of Bend to cut them down. There are ~5 trees in the HOA right now, on private property that will need to come down before 'fire season' starts (approximately the end of May). If you know that a tree of yours needs to come down, FireFree Days might be a good way to save money on its disposal. Please do not cut down healthy trees without first seeking HOA Board approval.

Planned External Changes to your Home

A reminder: as per the CC&Rs, any architectural changes or modifications, as well as the repainting of your home, require approval from the HOA Board, to maintain consistency and harmony of our neighborhood. Please make your request to the Board via E-mail BEFORE doing any work. A copy of the CC&Rs can be found on the website.
