Today, we're going to learn about the American flag. It's a symbol of our country, the United States of America. Let's explore its history and meaning together!




Did you know? The American flag was born on June 14, 1777. Our flag has 13 stripes and 50 stars. The stripes stand for the first 13 colonies, and the stars represent all 50 states.




Our flag's colors are red, white, and blue. Red stands for <u>bravery</u>, white means <u>purity</u>, and blue represents <u>justice</u>.


so big it can cover a football field! People fly the flag to show pride in our country.



to the moon! Astronauts from the United States planted the flag on the moon in 1969.




The "Pledge of Allegiance" is:

Let's color another picture! How about an eagle holding the American flag?




September 11, 2001, was a sad day in our history.




Complete this Maze and help the American flag reach the finish line! Pretend you're helping a brave hero carry the flag to a special celebration.
