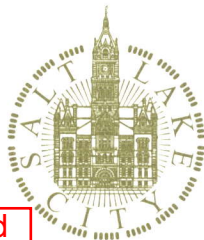

The notice of appeal must state your name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number and the relief you seek. The City requests that you also include a copy of your GRAMA request, if applicable.
