While the conference focused on international medical missions, I believe medical missions can be carried out daily in our actions as physicians and students. Each patient we see is an opportunity for us to provide a service and share the Gospel.

Some of the new opportunities I learned about at GMHC included rotations, residencies, Mercy Ships, short term, and long term international service options. It was encouraging to hear that there are several programs that can connect medical students to Christian medical missions, working with our schedules to set up a week or an entire rotation. I enjoyed getting more information about Mercy Ships. Mercy Ships are large cruise ships with 5 OR suites on board and over 80 recovery beds that travel up and down the coast performing surgeries and procedures on indigenous people.

The GMHC was a fantastic conference to attend and I would encourage any student and health care provider to attend if they are interested in learning more about medical missions or want to get plugged in with an organization that can set up a medical mission. I learned so much about myself and my faith and also about the numerous opportunities available now and after graduation. My weekend was fantastic and I met so many amazing people and loved hearing so many of their stories and experiences.
