'Dillinger,' a 1941 Buick Sedanette, takes Custom d'Elegance honors at Sacramento

John Dillinger, gunned down in July 1934 by Melvin Purvis and his FBI colleagues, probably wouldn't have won any beauty contests. A custom 1941 Buick sedanette named for the notorious gangster, on the other hand, just scored a pair of automotive equivalents, taking home both the Custom d'Elegance Award and the World's Most Beautiful Custom Award, presented February 18 at the 68th-annual Sacramento Autorama in Sacramento, California.



Built by Lucky 7 Customs in Antioch, California, and owned by Clifford Mattis, Dillinger wears a chopped and channeled prewar Buick body, though power comes from a small block Chevy V-8 (wearing, oddly enough, vintage Oldsmobile valve covers) instead of the original Buick Fireball 8 straight-eight. Sunday wasn't Dillinger's first time in the spotlight, either; at last month's Grand National Roadster Show, Mattis' Buick took home the 2018 Steve's Auto Restorations Award.

In a show that featured more than 900 vehicles on display — including bikes, boats, muscle cars, hot rods, customs, and trucks — Dillinger

beat out five other finalists to earn the Custom d'Elegance Award, presented to the best hand-built custom from 1935-'48 that "embodies the spirit of a true classic custom." Previous notable builders who've taken top honors include Gene Winfield, George Barris, Joe "Candy Apple Red" Bailon, and John D'Agostino.



The World's Most Beautiful Custom Award, also presented to Dillinger, is given annually to the judges' favorite custom — from 1936 to present day — that "incorporates a silhouette change including chop, channel, or section." Created to honor the founder of Autorama, H.A. Bagdasarian, the 8-foot-tall trophy is a "perpetual award," meaning that winner Mattis will have his name enshrined alongside past recipients.

Fifty-Five Years Ago

The Eastern Idaho Vintage Motor Car Club of America (EIVMCCA) is now officially fifty-five years old this month. Ten years ago, the Gas Line had an article on the formation of the club, starting out as the Snake River Vintage Auto Club. The club celebrated with the March meeting at the 5 and Diner (now Dixie's Diner) in Idaho Falls.

I thought it would be interesting to remember the words of Joe Keller on the formation of our old car club.

Joe Keller – The Gas Line – March 2008

The Antique Automobile Club of America was founded September 1935, the Horseless Carriage Club November 1937, the Veteran Motor Car Club of America December 1938, and the Snake River Vintage Auto Club March 2, 1963. The beginning of each of these is based on a similar story: a small group of people interested in joining forces to help preserve, promote, and enjoy antique automobiles.

The Snake River Vintage Auto Club began with a meeting in Blackfoot ID in thoughts that a valley wide approach would gather together a critical mass of enthusiasts to sustain a club. Paul Bragg, a manager at KUPI radio, advertised the first meeting, and became the first president. Larry Pratt, also of Idaho Falls became the first Vice-President.

Prior to the club formation, there were a number of enthusiasts in the Snake River Valley pursuing the hobby individually and joining together in small groups. John Dawdy, a charter member was driving a 1949 Ford as a daily driver while waiting to have his 1929 REO Flying Cloud transferred from Yakima, WA. Joe Keller, another charter member was driving a 1928 Model A Ford as his high school car and was working with his brothers on restoring a 1929 Buick Roadster. Richard Eagle was driving a 1930 Model A and attended the second club meeting. Richard Bingham was beginning the restoration of a Model T. Steve Bemount was driving a Model A and he is now the president of his car club in Alberta, Canada. Gary Schwartzenberger was driving and is still driving his 1930 Model A. The Derbidges of Pocatello had a number of autos that participated in the early years. Lynn Erickson had his 1929 Model A Special Coupe as well as a 1940 Plymouth Sedan as his daily driver.

I can remember well the room we met at the first meeting. Attendance was very good. The thought that I would be writing down this occasion 45 years later never crossed my mind. My thoughts were full of visions of restored antique autos. They still are and that is what drives this club onward.
