Vintage cars take over Twin Falls

TWIN FALLS, Idaho (KMVT/KSVT) About 100 vintage cars were in the Magic Valley area this past week, as part of 73rd annual Revival AAA Glidden Tour.

On Friday, KMVT's Rachel Fabbi rode in the back seat of a 1930 Model A from the Twin Falls County Fairgrounds to Dierkes Lake, and learned how it's different from modern cars.

Car owner Mark Schwartzenberger explained that besides the lack of seat belts, there are a few other differences.

"When you first get in to start it up, you have to turn on your gas valve, you know, get your gas tank going, and put it in choke, you got to choke it and that and get it going, and get your throttle set right," Schwartzenberger said.



And when it comes to driving it, things don't get more basic.

"There are no sun visors, so you have to work around that," Schwartzenberger said. "You don't have turn signals, so you have to know how to do your arm signals."

Matthew Conde, the public affairs official for AAA Idaho, explained what kind of cars they had for the past 72 years.

"It's been going for many years, but it's pre-World War II cars, out on the roads, touring various parts of the country each year, and we're blessed to have them here in Twin Falls," Conde said.

Conde said this was the first time the tour has come to Idaho.

"They do a lot of them back East, and people just can't get out there from the West, so we've got a lot more local folks from Idaho, Utah, Colorado, that have made the journey, but we have people as far away as Florida, Michigan, Georgia," Conde said.

The group of cars toured various areas of the Magic Valley, including Murtaugh Lake County Park, Lake Walcott State Park, Pomerelle Mountain Resort, Shoshone, Sun Valley, Craters of the Moon, Three Island Crossing State Park, Minidoka National Historical Site, Jerome Museum, downtown Twin Falls, Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument and Balanced Rock, to name many of the stops.
