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About Anne Arundel Community College (AACC)

The main campus is located in Arnold, MD, just a few miles outside of Historic Annapolis and the U.S. Naval Academy. (See next slide.)

There are several off-campus sites, including:

- Arundel Mills a four-story, 77,000 square foot facility. Designated by the state as a Regional Higher Education Center. Houses the AACC University Consortium that allows students to attain a four-year degree without leaving the county. (Photo)
- *Glen Burnie Town Center* a five-story building, which is the future home of the Intermodal Transportation Center and Logistics Learning Lab. (See later slide.)
- Total credit and noncredit student enrollment is approx. 47,000.

Transportation, Logistics & Cargo Security (TLCS) Program

AACC is located minutes from the U.S. Naval Academy and in close proximity to Baltimore Washington Thurgood Marshall International Airport, the Port of Baltimore, the Maritime Institute of Technology and Graduate Studies (MITAGS), Fort George G. Meade, the National Security Agency, U.S. Cyber Command, and many other government agencies and private industries.

This location makes AACC ideally situated to provide programming that gives students the broad knowledge, skills, and training required to work in jobs related to cargo handling, warehouse and distribution, supply chain logistics, airport and seaport operations, related technologies, and security operations.

We strive to close the skills gap that exists at ports, marinas, and airports in the Central Maryland region and to identify the next generation of such workers.



TLCS Program Target Areas

- **Dual enrollment** high school dual enrolled students
- *Job-ready training* those needing a job-ready credential, including recent high school graduates and adults
- *Incumbent worker training* workforce contracts with federal agencies and industry that need employee training
- *Skilled Trades training* training in plumbing, welding, electric, HVAC, forklift and eventually specific marine skilled trades, including composite.
- **Drone/Robotic training** training in marine drone technology
- Apprenticeships





High School Dual Enrollment – Signature Program at North County High School

AACC teaches its Transportation, Logistics, and Cargo Security program onsite at North County High School (NCHS), which is in northern part of the county closest to Baltimore and the port, airport, and industry. Additional high schools to be added.

AACC and NCHS create college and career pathways through partnerships with other community and business partners at Baltimore Washington International Airport, the Port of Baltimore, the Maryland Department of Transportation, and numerous warehousing and distribution companies in the region.

Students graduate with a college Certificate at the same time they receive their High School Diploma, and prior to HS graduation they can sit for the APICS Certified Logistics, Transportation and Distribution exam.

Fun Fact: TLCS Students Streamline Warehouse Operations on Campus

TLCS students in the *Logistics Technologies* course developed and implemented a logistics technology solution for inventory tracking for AACC's Dance Studio in partnership with Barcoding, Inc.

Students completed this work as a service learning project. They plan to work with other AACC departments, including Photography and Theatre, that need inventory tracking capabilities.







AACC's Intermodal Transportation Center at Glen Burnie Town Center

Work is underway to transform one floor of the off-site location, the Glen Burnie Town Center, into an Intermodal Transportation Center, complete with a *Logistics Learning Lab*, which will include:

- Intermodal Resource Library
- Classrooms
- Simulated Warehouse Lab with racks, shelving, barcoding equipment
- Demonstration space for pick/pack operations, ship lashings, airport airside operations
- Computer Simulation Lab for port, airport, warehousing/distribution, and intermodal simulation programs
- Lobby, conference room, offices, kitchen, lounge

Workforce Contracts



Federal agency incumbent workers

• In spring 2019 AACC began its fifth cohort of 25 students each in partnership with the Intelligence industry in and around Fort George G. Meade area that includes the National Security Agency and the Central Intelligence Agency.

Industry incumbent workers

 Acquiring workforce contracts with industry through partnerships with the college's Workforce Development office, Anne Arundel Economic Development Corporation, Anne Arundel Workforce Development Corporation, Maryland State Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation.



TLCS Program Expanding into Skilled Trades & Drones

- AACC has launched an aggressive Capital Campaign to build the *Center for Innovation and Skilled Trades* at AACC. The initial build will be a 12,000 square foot facility to house skilled trades, including: Plumbing, Welding, Electric, HVAC, and Forklift and expanding to marine skilled trades, including composite. (See next slide.)
- AACC is collaborating with the *American Boat and Yacht Council* (ABYC) with the vision of adopting ABYC curriculum and building an ABYC-compliant shop in the new Center for Innovation and Skilled Trades to eventually become a Marine League School.
- AACC is collaborating with the *Anne Arundel County Marine Advisory Board* to create credit (Marine Manager and Dock Master curriculum) and noncredit (skilled trades opportunities) for residential and commercial marina workers in the region.
- AACC has created *LASR* @ *AACC* (Land, Air, Sea Robotics) in collaboration with the UAS (Unmanned Aerial Systems) Academy. A drone/robotic lab and drone student club have been created on campus, and over 25 faculty have been trained as FAA-approved drone pilots. *LASR* curriculum is currently being integrated into existing courses and some students are working with local marinas.
