Speaker for our April 12th Meeting – Reminder: "Kathie Jackson founded Hospice by the Sea, a Medicare certified hospice agency in 1994 as a sole owner/operator. Her mission was and remains to be individualized hospice care in San Diego County. Kathie's first introductions to hospice services was as an Executive Director of a nationwide hospice. Kathie found this to be "cookie cutter" service designed with profit being the mission rather than service designed with each individual patient and family as the focus. To that end, Kathie remains today as the Administrator of Hospice by the Sea, now 30 years later and has chosen to resist being purchased by a larger organization, which would limit the provision of hospice services who live in a variety of settings. "Most Americans need more information about hospice services in order to make educated decisions about their end-of-life care. Considering the discussions taking place in the media, online and in other arenas, there is a growing consciousness about death and dying. We all deserve to live well with supportive services at the end of life. We should all be able to die as well as we have lived." Ms. Jackson will explain to us the ins and outs of the services offered by Hospice as well as other pertinent information that we need to be aware of. Please try and attend this very important meeting.

RECYCLE REPORT

Spring arrives this month but it feels like it's here already.

Thank you for recycling - in February we added \$195.53 to our account for a total of \$333.78 already! It was a very good, if short, month. I've seen moving trucks unloading, For Sale signs coming down, and new people walking; don't forget to encourage new neighbors to recycle with us!

Also thank you for separating clean, dry plastic from glass and aluminum, and for removing caps to make it easier (and faster) for Mark. The recycling company pays less for containers with liquid in them so we empty them. Don't forget to put those caps in the bag with the bottles tho.

Remember that we can <u>NOT</u> get paid for plastic and/or glass bottles, or aluminum cans that had **any kind of <u>food or oil</u>** in them. Also thank you for not bringing SCRAP: aka solid white and/or solid colored plastic bottles for example yogurt drinks, Ensure, SlimFast, laundry detergent, bleach, etc or ANY cleaning product container.

No plastic juice and/or large opaque milk & water bottles, UNLESS they have CRV on them.

Please put these in your city blue recycling bin, since it takes a huge bag to make a quarter!

YES to clean, dry containers such as all aluminum beverage cans; plastic ice tea; glass soda, beer, wine and liquor bottles and anything else marked CRV or California Redemption Value.

Drop off your bags over the west gate at 3639 North Way or **call/text Lynette 760-717-9121** if you need a pick up or have questions. Don't forget to take some empty bags when you drop off. Many just had water bottles in them. There's enough for your neighbors too.

HUMAN INTEREST STORY (submitted by Steve Good)

Costa Serena Home gets mural painted by Inka Zamoyska. Inka Zamoyska, a renown Polish artist, has completed a mural in a home in Costa Serena, which depicts the home's backyard view. The kitchen wall painting remains accurate to the basic elements of the view, but it's not an exact reproduction. Inka was born in Canada of Polish parents who escaped during World War II. Her



father was held captive at Dachau and Auschwitz. In 1945 as the war was ending, the German Gestapo took about 130 of the top prisoners to bargain with as hostages and marched them to Austria, where they managed to escape. (See, Wikipedia article, "Transport of concentration camp inmates to Tyrol.") Inka's ancestral residence, a palace of the Zamoyski family in Poland was taken over by the Germans in WWII and nationalized by the communists in 1944. Inka's family never obtained the return of their home after the war. However, today the former home of her parents is now a museum. (https://www.muzeumzamoyskich.pl/)Inka

moved to the United States at age 23, married, and followed her left brain and right brain by becoming both an artist and an accountant. She moved to Southern California about 20 years ago, transfixed by the area's natural beauty. Her co-workers would stop by her cubicle, marvel at her paintings, sit and rest. 

Updating the Home

My friends often ask me whether they should make changes to their home. Over the years I have learned a few absolute truths about the costs and the benefits. FLAG RULES

Here are some interesting guidelines when flying our flag. I've highlighted the most salient points related to home use:

- The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously.
- The flag is never allowed to touch the ground or floor.
- When hung over a sidewalk on a rope extending form a building to a pole, the union stars are always away from the building.
- When vertically hung over the center of the street, the flag always has the union stars to the north in an east/west street, and to the east in a north/south street.
- The flag of the United States of America should at the center and at the highest point of the group when a number of flags of states or localities or pennants of societies are grouped and displayed from staffs.
- The flag should never be festooned, drawn back, nor up, in folds but always allowed to fall free.
- The flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon on memorial day then raised to the top of the staff.
- Never fly the flag upside down except as a signal of distress in instances of extreme danger to life or property.
- The flag is never flown in inclement weather except when using an all-weather flag.
- The flag can be flown every day from sunrise to sunset and at night if illuminated properly.
