CHAIR REPORT

(Hello neighbors, I've turned over the front page of the newsletter to Ray Brown, Landscape Committee Member. I believe you will find this interesting. Sharon Martinson, Chair.) Hev Folks!

As the newest member of the committee, it was a fun exercise to think about and undertake "What the CSAC is doing" for all residents.

What your CSAC does for you!

Unlike the traditional HOA fee in San Diego of \$200–\$600 per month CSAC depends entirely on your donations.

1. The Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA) states that a community may lose its age-restricted status if the number of people aged 55 and older in the community falls below 80%. The loss of status is permanent.

What your CSAC DOES: To avoid losing our status the Committee constantly monitors and surveys age requirements monthly.

2. The National Association of REALTORS®: Things that will reduce your property value quickly. e.g., your neighbors with unregistered cars and junk-strewn yards, visible trash containers, poor exterior paintwork, deferred maintenance, An unsightly yard, too much personalization, noise pollution, unapproved fencing, or structural changes.

What your CSAC DOES: we offer a permit process for changes to your home, we continually monitor the neighborhood, we provide site inspections, propose corrective action, write warning letters, and seek legal advice if appropriate.

3. Where do your donations go? Of the 696 homes; our donations are at around 27% of all residents.

What your CSAC DOES: Publishing and printing a monthly Newsletter, welcome materials for all new residents, we print and mail the annual material for committee nominations, as well as Age Surveys to all residents to maintain our HUD compliance. Your donations are also used to pay attorney fees when necessary.

4. Volunteers

What your CSAC DOES: The CSAC are all-volunteer positions, The newsletter is developed and published by a volunteer position, The website

at https://costaserenaseniorcommunity.com is developed and maintained with a volunteer position, the welcome committee is all volunteer, the newsletter delivered to your door or emailed to you is an all volunteer effort along with our recycling work, The Costa Serena drop box (suggestion box) is also monitored by volunteers.

5. The Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions for Costa Serena

What your CSAC DOES: The CC&R is a 21-page document that outlines your protections, and restrictions and provides a guide to keep Costa Serena a community. The CSAC is grateful for your support, volunteer efforts, and donations. Thank you!

RECYCLE REPORT

Happy "Eat Ice Cream For Breakfast Day!" (Feb 3). Hope that you had a wonderful January! Wow, thanks recyclers! January's recycling added \$209.60 to our account to start the year off well. Some donors have moved away, so don't forget to encourage your new neighbors to recycle with us! Also thank you for separating clean, dry plastic from glass and aluminum, and for removing caps to make it easier (and faster) for Mark and me. The recycling company pays less for containers with liquid in them so we empty them. Don't forget to put those caps in the bag tho.

And yay - liquor and wine bottles are being recycled for MONEY again!

Remember that we can <u>NOT</u> get paid for plastic and/or glass bottles, or aluminum cans that had **any kind** of <u>food or oil</u> in them

Also thank you for not bringing **SCRAP:** aka solid white and/or solid colored plastic bottles for ex. yogurt drinks, Ensure, SlimFast, laundry detergent, bleach, etc or ANY cleaning product container.

No plastic juice and/or large opaque milk & water bottles, UNLESS they have CRV on them.

Please put these in your city blue recycling bin, since it takes a <u>huge bag</u> to make a quarter!

YES to clean containers such as all aluminum beverage cans; plastic ice tea; glass soda, beer, wine and liquor

YES to clean containers such as all aluminum beverage cans; plastic ice tea; glass soda, beer, wine and liquol bottles and anything else marked CRV or California Redemption Value.

Drop off your bags over the west gate at 3639 North Way or call/text Lynette 760-717-9121 if you need a pick up. Don't forget to take some empty bags when you drop off. Many just had water bottles in them. There's enough for your neighbors too.




