2026 COMPETITION PACKET

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Competition Rules & Entry Requirements

1. **Gourd entries must be the work of the artist.** Be mindful that gourds should be original in design and not copied from a book or from a class project. Any entry that is verbatim from a pattern or class is not eligible for judging. To be eligible for judging, gourds adapted from patterns and classes must reflect the entrant's ability to make the design or technique their own. **Copyrighted images will not be accepted.**
2. **Gourds must predominate in all categories.** Judges may disqualify an entry if they feel that this is not the case. Where permitted, use of man-made and natural materials shall be limited to 25% of the gourd surface covered.
3. **All cut and open gourds must be cleaned or finished on the inside unless the artist has stated it as part of their design.**
4. **Stems are not required.** If stems are present, they must be cleaned and neat.
5. **Stands are allowed for gourds that do not sit up on their own.** These stands must be simple and will not be considered in the judging. Any gourd that does not sit solidly will not be accepted. Rotating stands for highly decorated gourds will be allowed, but not turned-on during judging.
6. **Fractaled gourds, including faux fractal are not permitted in competition.**
7. **Gourds previously entered in the FGS Festival may not be entered again unless the gourd was disqualified or has been substantially re-worked.**
8. **Photo documentation is required for verifying the process used on complicated entries.**
9. **No business cards in the exhibition area.**
10. **The Florida Gourd Society will attempt to provide reasonable security for all entries but assumes no responsibility for damage to or theft of an entry.**
11. **Competitors must submit an Entry Form (pages 12-13)**
12. **Only one entry per category.**
13. **Each gourd must have an entry tag attached to it (page 14).**
 - A. **You** must mark your tags "yes" or "no" allowing judges/clerks to move your gourd from the category you chose if it does not fit the criteria for that category. Gourds left in wrong categories will be disqualified from judging.
 - B. **You** must mark the tag "yes" or "no" if you wish to sell your entry at the end of the festival. Indicate the sale price.
14. **Permissions:** A permission form is on page 1 of the Entry Form. Artists must sign this form to permit use of photos of their entries for publicity. They have the option of permitting use of a personal photo for publicity.
15. **Skill Levels:** A person's skill level for Division V, VI, and VII is determined by past participation in Gourd Festivals. A participant may be moved up a level, if deemed appropriate by the Festival Committee. Please refer to page 5 for details.

Each DIVISION and CATEGORY has specific requirements.

Entry Instructions, Fees, Check-In & Pick Up Details

The preferred method for entering the Gourd Festival is to **MAIL** entry forms.

They must be postmarked by February 13th.

WALK-IN ENTRY FORMS ONLY accepted from Noon to 4:00 pm on Friday, February 20th.

EXCEPTION: Volunteers who help set up on Thursday between 10:30 am and 4:30 pm may check in and enter a total of three gourds (3) **FREE**.

ENTRY FEES

Florida Gourd Society current MEMBERS: No registration fee. Members receive one (1) **FREE** gourd entry. Additional entries are \$2.00 each. **EXCEPTION:** If you **VOLUNTEER** to help set up on Thursday between 10 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., you may enter a total of three (3) gourds for **FREE**. You may also check in on Thursday.

How to become a Florida Gourd Society Member: Annual fee is **\$12.00**. Go to www.flgourdsoc.org. Membership includes the quarterly newsletter, *GOURDVINE*, that includes activities in Florida Patches. You will also receive a membership card, and discounts available at some hotels during the festival. **OR**, you may join at the Festival at the front Entrance table. **OR**, when you sign up for classes at the Festival.

NON-MEMBERS: You do not have to be a member to compete. Registration fee is \$10.00, plus \$2.00 for each gourd entry. *Please remit a check, payable to FGS, with your two-page entry form.*

YOUTH ENTRIES: NO REGISTRATION FEE OR ENTRY FEE. See separate registration form.

CHECK-IN TIMES

No late entries will be accepted!

Check-In is on Friday, February 20, 2026, unless you volunteer on Thursday.

MAILED-IN ENTRY FORMS- 8:30 am – 4:00 pm **ONLY**. Tags must be attached.

WALK-IN ENTRY FORMS- NOON– 4:30 pm Bring your two-page entry form, cash or check for fees, and attach a tag to each entry.

PICK-UP TIME

Pick up is on Sunday, February 22nd at 3:00 pm. You or your representative must present the stub from your entry tag. Any gourd not picked up by 3:30 PM will be donated to FGS for auction at next festival.

Criteria and Awards

AGS JUDGING CRITERIA: Overall appearance, craftsmanship, difficulty/level of effort and featured technique/theme. 75% Workmanship, 25% Creativity, Originality and Uniqueness

Judges are certified through the American Gourd Society. The judge's decisions will be final. The Head Judge has the right to award additional awards. It is not mandatory that the judges give out all the awards if the entries do not meet the requirements of the category or workmanship does not merit an award.

DIVISIONS & DIVISION RULES

DIVISION I- DRIED Must be grown by the entrant. Stem not required. If present, must be cleaned and neat. No wax, stains, or paints. Must be true to type of gourd.

DIVISION II- DRIED, MANIPULATED Must be grown by the entrant. Stem not required. If present, must be cleaned and neat. Gourd must be clean. No wax, stains, or paints. Must be true to type of gourd. May be knotted, coiled, or etched.

Category 5: SINGLE GOURD. May have been knotted, coiled, and/or grown in a hand-made or commercial mold.

Category 6. MULTIPLE GOURDS. They must be inseparable, can be manipulated in one or more ways, including grown in a mold. Can be grown in same year or different year.

DIVISION III- YOUTH COMPETITION Open to youth age 3-19. Refer to the separate Youth Competition packet for entry information, artistry rules, awards, and categories.

DIVISION IV - ADULT NOVICE SKILL LEVEL This Division is for crafter/artist who understands the basic techniques. They may have sold gourds but have not taught a gourd class for a fee. May be class work or from patterns with noticeable changes.

DIVISION V - ADULT INTERMEDIATE SKILL LEVEL This Division is for the crafter/artist that has advanced from beginning techniques. An Intermediate Artist has won one of the following from the Novice Level: 15 Blue Ribbons, or 1 Best of Division, or 1 Best of Festival.

DIVISION VI – ADULT MASTER SKILL LEVEL This Division is for the crafter/artist that has exceptional advanced skills. A Master Level Artist has won one of the following: 30 Blue Ribbons at the lower levels, or 1 Best of Division at the Intermediate level, or 1 Best of Festival at the Intermediate level.

DIVISION VII – ADULT CRAFTED SKILL LEVEL Open to adults of any skill level.

Multiple gourds or gourd pieces may be used.

NO DIVISION – Category 65

SPECIAL EXHIBITION- FOR DISPLAY ONLY- “MY IDEA, MY WAY “

Looking for the most outlandish, extravagant, genius piece. Single or multiple figures allowed. Any theme or technique or materials allowed. This entry may be done by a single person or a group. Must be sturdy and stand solidly. A wood base may be used for support. Must fit into a 3’ wide x 2’ deep area. Not higher than 60”. *Ribbons will be awarded, but this category will not be eligible for the Best of Division or Best of Festival award.*

JIM STORY NATIONAL COMPETITION- Winner of DIV II is eligible to enter the Jim Story National Competition. Details on Page 11.

CATEGORY LISTINGS & RULES

Each **DIVISION** and **CATEGORY** has specific requirements.

Entries that do not fit into Division IV, V, or VI may fit into Division VII.

DIVISION I- DRIED CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 1 – LARGEST IN CIRCUMFERENCE

CATEGORY 2 – LONGEST OVERALL LENGTH FROM TIP TO TIP

CATEGORY 3 – SMALLEST GOURD IN OVERALL SIZE

CATEGORY 4 – UGLIEST, FREAKIEST, GROWN NATURALLY

DIVISION II- DRIED- MANIPULATED, HAND TRAINED CATEGORIES

Winner is Eligible for National Jim Story competition.

CATEGORY 5 – SINGLE GOURD

DIVISION III- YOUTH COMPETITION

Refer to the separate Youth Competition packet for artistry rules and categories.

Paint & Material Clarifications

Transparent Colors & Opaque Paints are allowed in Categories 10-65, unless noted.

Transparent Colors: Includes stain, dyes, wax, varnish

Opaque Paints: Includes any application using paints, stains, dyes, inks, or varnish of opaque nature. Opaque Paints include *stains and dyes* which cover the surface completely, such as black and white, and will be considered a paint technique.

Man-made and Natural Materials are allowed in Categories 10-65, unless noted.

Man-made Materials: Includes beads, artificial objects, cords, ribbons, and silk/plastic flowers.

Natural Materials: Include feathers, dried seed pods, dried flowers, bark, bones, shells, vines, leather.

Natural Material Exception: Waxed linen and artificial sinew are allowed for sewing rim treatments.

DIVISION IV- ADULT NOVICE SKILL LEVEL CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 10 - CARVED, CHISELED, CHIPPED, GOUGED, CUT DESIGN, FILIGREE

May combine techniques. May use transparent or opaque colors *as an accent*.

CATEGORY 11 - PAINTED GOURD

Whole or cut.

CATEGORY 12 - FIBER TECHNIQUES - Weaving/Coiling/Tenerife/Crochet/Knit

Any technique using fabric, thread, ribbon, rope, yarn. May combine techniques.

CATEGORY 13 - BEADED GOURD

With or without lid. May use transparent or opaque color *as an accent*. If color is used, entry will be judged on its compliment to the gourd design. **EXCEPTION – beads may cover the whole surface.**

CATEGORY 14 – PYROGRAPHY

Wood burned design must predominate. With or without color.

CATEGORY 15 - SCULPTURE or ASSEMBLAGE

Includes furniture items.

CATEGORY 16 - MIXED MEDIA- Decoupage/Clay/Gold leaf/Papier mâché/Inlay/Wire/Etc

May include techniques such as woodburning, carving, etc.

CATEGORY 17 - JEWELRY- Single items or sets, name tags, hair clips.

CATEGORY 18 - WEARABLE- purses, back packs, belts, hats

Any combination of techniques and embellishments allowed.

CATEGORY 19 - BOWL/VASE/TEAPOT/PITCHER/URN

With or without lid. Can be functional or decorative.

CATEGORY 20 - MINIATURE- No jewelry or holiday items

Gourd must be three inches or less in height, length, and width including attachments.

CATEGORY 21 - GOURD MASKS/WALL HANGINGS

Masks may be decorative or wearable. Wall hangings include swags, mirrors.

CATEGORY 22 - COMBINATION OF TECHNIQUES

May not fit into any other categories 10 through 21. Must use 3 or more techniques.

DIVISION V- ADULT INTERMEDIATE CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 23 - CARVED, CHISELED, CHIPPED, GOUGED, CUT DESIGN, FILIGREE

May combine techniques. May use transparent or opaque colors *as an accent*.

CATEGORY 24 - PAINTED GOURD

Whole or cut.

CATEGORY 25- FIBER TECHNIQUES- Weaving/Coiling/Tenerife/Crochet/Knit

Any technique using fabric, thread, ribbon, rope, yarn. May combine techniques.

CATEGORY 26 - BEADED GOURD

With or without lid. May use transparent or opaque color *as an accent*. If color is used, the entry will be judged on its compliment to the gourd design. **EXCEPTION – beads may cover the whole surface.**

CATEGORY 27 - PYROGRAPHY

Wood burned design must predominate. With or without color.

CATEGORY 28 - SCULPTURE or ASSEMBLAGE

Includes furniture items.

CATEGORY 29 - MIXED MEDIA- Decoupage/Clay/Gold leaf/Papier mâché/Inlay/Wire/Etc

May include techniques such as woodburning, carving, etc.

CATEGORY 30 - JEWELRY- Single items or sets, name tags, hair clips.

CATEGORY 31 - WEARABLE- purses, back packs, belts, hats

Any combination of techniques and embellishments allowed.

CATEGORY 32 - BOWL/VASE/TEAPOT/PITCHER/URN

With or without lid. Can be functional or decorative.

CATEGORY 33 - MINIATURE- No jewelry or holiday items

Gourd must be three inches or less in height, length, and width including attachments.

CATEGORY 34 - GOURD MASKS/WALL HANGINGS

Masks may be decorative or wearable. Wall hangings include swags, mirrors.

CATEGORY 35 - COMBINATION OF TECHNIQUES

May not fit into any other categories 23 through 34. Must use 3 or more techniques.

DIVISION VI- ADULT MASTER CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 36 - CARVED, CHISELED, CHIPPED, GOUGED, CUT DESIGN, FILIGREE

May combine techniques. May use transparent or opaque colors *as an accent*.

CATEGORY 37 - PAINTED GOURD

Whole or cut. No Man-made or Natural materials.

CATEGORY 38 - FIBER TECHNIQUES – Weaving/ Coiling/Tenerife/Crochet/ Knit

Any technique using fabric, thread, ribbon, rope, yarn. May combine techniques.

CATEGORY 39 - BEADED GOURD

With or without lid. May use transparent or opaque color *as an accent*. If color is used, entry will be judged on its compliment to the gourd design. **EXCEPTION – beads may cover the whole surface.**

CATEGORY 40 - PYROGRAPHY

Wood burned design must predominate. With or without color.

CATEGORY 41 - SCULPTURE or ASSEMBLAGE.

Includes furniture items.

CATEGORY 42 - MIXED MEDIA- Decoupage/Clay/Gold leaf/Papier mâché/Inlay/Wire/Etc

May include techniques such as woodburning, carving, etc

CATEGORY 43 - JEWELRY- Single items or sets, name tags, hair clips.

CATEGORY 44 - WEARABLE- purses, back packs, belts, hats

Any combination of techniques and embellishments allowed.

CATEGORY 45- BOWL/VASE/TEAPOT/PITCHER/URN

With or without lid. Can be functional or decorative.

CATEGORY 46- MINIATURE- No jewelry or holiday items

Gourd must be three inches or less in height, length, and width including attachments.

CATEGORY 47 - GOURD MASKS/WALL HANGINGS

Masks may be decorative or wearable. Wall hangings include swags, mirrors.

CATEGORY 48 - COMBINATION OF TECHNIQUES

May not fit into any other categories 36 through 47. Must use 3 or more techniques.

DIVISION VII- ADULT CRAFTED CATEGORIES

CATEGORY 49 - ILLUMINATED GOURDS/ LAMPS

Cut gourd with light source; Quality of illumination will impact judge's decision. Lamps must be functional with a light source, electrical or insert. Base, column, and/ or shade may be made from a gourd. Some components of the lamp may be from wood or may be purchased. May include holiday and seasonal themes.

CATEGORY 50 - NATIVE AMERICAN DESIGN

Designs that incorporate cultural, tribal, historical, or ceremonial motifs of Native American origin. May use natural materials for accents. Man-made items not allowed EXCEPT for beads. Waxed linen and artificial sinew are allowed in rim treatments. May use transparent or opaque colors.

CATEGORY 51 - SEASONAL GOURD- ANY SEASON- FALL-WINTER-SPRING-SUMMER

Not a holiday theme. Must convey the theme of the season chosen.

CATEGORY 52 - SINGLE HOLIDAY GOURD- ANY HOLIDAY

CATEGORY 53 - ANY HOLIDAY ITEM- SCENES, SWAGS, ARRANGEMENTS, BASKETS, FIGURES

CATEGORY 54 - ORNAMENTS- ANY SEASON OR HOLIDAY

CATEGORY 55 - GOURD SCENE INSIDE OF A GOURD-

May include a scene outside of the gourd.

CATEGORY 56 - GOURD FLORAL ARRANGEMENT/ GOURD FLOWER

Combination of gourds or gourd parts may be used.

CATEGORY 57 - BIRD HOUSE/ BIRD FEEDERS

CATEGORY 58 - IMAGINARY CREATURES

Magical or supernatural, cartoon, science fiction, steampunk, dragons, wizards, fairies.

CATEGORY 59 - TOY/GAME/DOLL/PUPPETS/MARIONETTES

Must be functional.

CATEGORY 60 - AMERICANA/PATRIOTIC

Single or multiple figures allowed.

CATEGORY 61 - MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

Must be functional.

CATEGORY 62 - ANIMALS/BIRDS/ FISH/REPTILES/INSECTS

CATEGORY 63 - CRAFTED MANIPULATED GOURD

The manipulated gourd may have been grown by someone other than the artist.

CATEGORY 64 - FLORIDA FESTIVAL THEME GOURD- *GOURD VIBES*

ADULT SPECIAL EXHIBITION

NO DIVISION: CATEGORY 65 – IT'S MY IDEA! I DID IT MY WAY!

Looking for the most outlandish, extravagant, genius piece. Single or multiple figures allowed. Any theme or technique or materials or paints allowed. This entry may be done by a single person or a group. Must be sturdy and stand solidly. A wood base may be used for support. Must fit into a 3' wide x 2' deep area. Not higher than 60". *Ribbons will be awarded, but this category will not be eligible for the Best of Division or Categories cash award.*

JIM STORY NATIONAL COMPETITION

The winner of DIVISION II – Manipulated Gourd is eligible to enter the *National* competition. It is up to the winner to complete and submit the application.
