STAY INCLUSIVE Refrain from discussing politics or excessive religious content, though mentioning that you are praying for them is appreciated. MAKE IT PERSONAL Share a bit about yourself. FOR ADULTS (over 18) feel free to include your contact information (mail or email) if you'd like to give them an option to reply.

Not sure what to say. Even a simple Thank You means the world to those who serve. A colorful drawing or painting can also brighten their day - just add a short not to explain the artwork. Important reminder All letters go through a screen process before they are sent, therefore envelopes are not needed.

Hugs for Soldiers - hugsforsoldiers.org - The instructions are very similar to the above. Please do not use glitter or confetti or any product that could come loose when we open the box or envelop.

October 2025 project:

Autumn Pumpkin basket taught by Peggy Thomas from a pattern by Kim Christmas entitled Autumn Kitty (the e-packet can be ordered from www.decorativepaintingstore.com).

This I painted on fabric screen material and also on a banner from Hobby Lobby. See picture of what needs to be base coated before class in October. Can be painted on surface of your choice. **

Paint: DecoArt Americana Acrylic

lamp black
Mustard seed
Antique gold deep
Raw sienna
Traditional burnt umber
Russet
Orange flame
Antique green
Plantation pine
Tomato red
Yellow light

Suggested Brushes:

Burnt orange

% flat wash
Small dry brush
2 Filbert
10/0 liner
Size 2 round
½ inch, %, ¼ angle or whatever you float with

Other supplies:

White graphite

Stylus Tracing paper Usual acrylics supplies

Preparation before class:

- Sand and seal and sand if you are painting on wood. Then paint entire background lamp black using the flat wash brush.
- Trace on pattern using white graphite paper.
- 3. Basecoat the lettering with mustard seed using the number two shader.
- Paint the pumpkin orange flame, using the appropriate size, flat shaders or angle brushes.
- Using the No. 2 Filbert, base coat the flowers with the following colors: the yellow flowers based with mustard seed, the green flowers base with antique Gold deep.

The rest we will do in class.


