

BROTHER TOBY'S REFLECTION: "IT IS TIME TO TAKE CARE OF EACH OTHER"

It is so important to constantly realize that **what we can practically do to build a better future for ourselves and those who follow us is to take care of each other — to heal each other.**



Helping each other begins with being aware of other people's hurts. This was what Matsuo Basho (1644-1694)

was trying to express in one of his greatest poems, written only a few weeks before he died. He was too ill to attend a poetry reading at a student's home and so he sent a poem. Like most haiku it can be rendered into English in many different ways. I choose to follow in the direction of our friend Cliff Edwards, and put it this way,

*Deep autumn,
My neighbor —
how is he doing?*

It seems to me that people who have accepted that they are on the final journey of life often

have great wisdom and can express it in a simple and profound way. I think Basho was saying that he no longer had to worry about tomorrow, and at such a moment he could genuinely escape from himself and ask,

How is my neighbor doing? Our friend Liz Mullins says that asking that question is the sign of a mature society. I think she is right. And if it's not being asked in the palaces of power, it is especially important for it to be asked on the roads and streets where each of us live.

I believe we are going to work things out somehow. The old arc of history can be relied upon to bend in the right direction but it could take much longer than we would like. I will close with a quote from William Carlos Williams,

One thing I am convinced more and more is true, and that is this: The only way to be truly happy is to make others happy. When you realize that and take advantage of the fact, everything is made perfect.


OLIVES

There is a new rural health center in an underserved Ugandan village. Founding doctor, Ivan Kabanda, grew up at the Starcross Kin Worldwide (SKW) House of Hope and was educated by SKW sponsors. Dr. Ivan provides villagers with immunizations, minor surgery, HIV education and testing, community health outreach as well as admitting patients for urgent care. Ivan was a 10 year old orphan when we met. A serious student, he walked miles to school hoping to become a doctor and open a clinic so people like his parents wouldn't have to die. He did it! We are very happy that Ivan has realized his dreams and is saving lives every day.




REMEMBERING LOVED ONES


CELEBRATING MILESTONES
