Brother Toby: THE PATH OFTEN BEGINS HERE

I frequently find a young person, after they've finished their work in the fields or the garden or the "forever wild" forest, sitting on a bench gazing out over the hillside. I know they're looking into the future and at the same time into their own inner world for that spiritual compass we all have.

Among the things we do here is provide a needed resting place for spiritual wanderers who are about to inherit the world. They tend to be flexible and searching for new ways of refreshing the sacred climate of the earth and its peoples.

It is a real privilege for me to share a few months with these young people. Our relationship will continue for a long time! This summer we hosted young people from 11 different countries and eight states in our own country. They were born into religious cultures including Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist, Jew-

ish, agnostic, Protestant, Catholic, Orthodox and others. But they are all searching for paths that lead into broader horizons. They are the ones who make Starcross a truly multi-faith community. And I am confident that they will make significant contributions to the well-being of



this troubled world.

Their search typically begins with finding ways to take better care of our common home — the earth. This inevitably leads to thoughts and actions about how we can take better care of each other.

As you and our other friends know, we've found ourselves engaged in a lot of activities here and around the world.

But on days like this it is simpler. The land itself is the teacher. I watch young people walking through the olive groves, and opening themselves to the peaceful environment that surrounds them.

One of the most important things Starcross does is provide a place for rest and reflection, a place for spiritual wanderers to focus energy and gather strength.
