





A LETTER TO THE WHOLE PARISH FROM FATHER MARCELLO IN THE MIDST OF THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC MARCH 18, 2020

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

At this time of global emergency, even though we are prevented by the current situation from seeing each other in person at Mass, I want to continue to be in touch with you and to be close to you and your families. You are never far from my thoughts and prayers, and this is true even more so in these days of uncertainty. I want you to know that I am with you.

One thing we know for sure is that "in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health," God's closeness to us is the one constant in our lives, the one thing of which we can always be certain. To my knowledge, the last time public Masses were suspended in much of our country was during the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918, so this experience is unlike anything we have known in our lifetimes.

Added to the suffering brought on by the danger and uncertainty of the present situation is the suffering of being separated, at least for a time, from in-person access to Mass, which truly is the source and summit of our faith and of our whole lives. Although public Masses in the presence of the faithful are currently suspended until at least April 3, Father Bochanski and I will continue to celebrate Mass privately here each day, mindful of the words of St. Pio of Pietrelcina ("Padre Pio") that "it would be easier for the world to exist without the sun than without the Holy Mass." Father Bochanski and I will fulfill all of the Sunday and weekday Mass intentions privately.

During these Masses we will be remembering all our parishioners and friends, especially those who are most vulnerable in our community. If you would like me to remember your family *by name* at these private Masses each day, or if you have any other intentions you would like me to remember at the Altar, please email them to me at: support@stcatherinetrumbull.com, and in the subject line, write "Prayer Intention".

Each weekend, for as long as public Masses are suspended, we will record a video of Sunday Mass celebrated in church by either Father Bochanski or me, we will post this video on our website, and will email a link of it to everyone who is on our email distribution list. We are also working on livestreaming daily Mass and providing a video of Stations of the Cross for Friday evenings. Feel free to pass this information along to family and friends, neighbors and co-workers.

With all this said, our church will not close, but will continue to be open Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. for private prayer in the presence of Christ himself in the Blessed Sacrament, reserved in the tabernacle. The red flickering lamp high above the sanctuary reminds us of Christ's enduring presence in the tabernacle, He who is with us always. His closeness to us, and his presence with us, are our greatest consolation during this perilous time.

In addition, each <u>Sunday</u> afternoon, from 1:00 p.m. until 3:00 p.m., the church will be open, and the Blessed Sacrament will be <u>exposed</u> for Adoration and silent prayer. I ask everyone to remember to maintain appropriate social distancing.


A vigil lamp burns at this moment before the statue of the Blessed Mother in church, representing our prayers to her, as we invoke her never-failing intercession for an end to this pandemic.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) will be available in the McClinch Family Center on Tuesday evenings from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. (or longer, if necessary; please note the new time) beginning on Tuesday, March 24. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will also take place at the same time. For sacramental emergencies, please call us at the parish office. Though the office is closed and staff members are working from home, we are checking messages regularly and are ready to respond quickly.

So, to recap:

- Church open for private prayer Mon Fri 8 am 1 pm
- Eucharistic Adoration Sun 1 3 pm in church; Tue 6 8 pm in the Family Center
- Confession Tue 6 8 pm in the Family Center (no Saturday confessions)
- Sunday Mass, Stations, etc., will be recorded and emailed to you.

I will stay in touch with you throughout this situation. Through letters such as this, and through our parish email and social media communications, I will keep you updated and connected. Above all, let's all intentionally maintain our sense of faith and hope – come what may – and let's continue to stay in touch with each other, above all through prayer.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

The Friday before Palm Sunday is devoted to honoring the Seven Sorrows of our Blessed Mother. Further information will be provided.



The hymn alludes to the passage in the Book of Revelation which speaks of "a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars" (Rev. 12:1). The Latin word for "crown" being "corona," this prayer, set to music, invokes the one who wears the "corona" of twelve stars to intercede for all who are affected by the pandemic, and to bring a swift end to it.

Next Sunday's Gospel The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Next weekend's Sunday Gospel reading is provided here, so that we can think and pray about it, and be ready to receive it into our minds and hearts when it is proclaimed at Mass.



The sisters of Laza-

rus sent word to Jesus, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, Your brother will rise." Martha said, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him. *John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45*
