



LETTER #2 TO THE WHOLE PARISH FROM FATHER MARCELLO IN THE MIDST OF THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC MARCH 24, 2020

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Yesterday, a friend of mine emailed me and said,

"I am praying that some good news – any good news! – about the virus comes out this week." That's a beautiful intention that I'm sure we are all praying for.

I've decided to write a letter to you at least once a week, for as long as public Masses are suspended, so that we can stay in touch. But I'll keep them brief in the hopes that everyone will read them!

Here's something interesting: the consecration of our church took place one year ago today. On that joyful morning, none of us could have imagined what the world's circumstances – and our own – would be like, exactly one year later.

This afternoon, after the church closes for the day, I will celebrate Mass in our church to mark the Solemnity of the anniversary of the church's Consecration. The 12 consecration candles around the church will be lighted – but, out of necessity, the pews and the rest of the church will be empty, except for Jesus in the tabernacle, and me. Undoubtedly, it will be eerie and unsettling – even as it will also be quietly beautiful and consoling.

I will think back to the full church of one year ago – and I will bring all of you with me to the Altar in my heart and mind, very specially remembering each of you at Mass today, together with your families and your intentions. And, when I look out at the 12 lighted consecration candles, points of brightness along the walls of the dimly lit church, it certainly will bring to mind the words of the prologue of the Gospel of St. John: "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (Jn. 1:5).

My friends, the fact remains that – no matter what – Christ is risen, and He remains so. His light continues to shine on, and no darkness can extinguish it.

These are difficult days for all of us, but they are also filled with graces, which we'll find if we look for them. As I celebrate Mass this afternoon, with the candles glowing in the 12 places where the Bishop anointed the walls of the church one year ago today, they will in a way represent our collective looking forward to the day that this church will be full again, and we can finally resume worshiping together. Then, as Jesus said, "our hearts will rejoice."

In addition, the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) will be available in the McClinch Family Center on Tuesday evenings, beginning TONIGHT, from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. or longer, if necessary; please note the new time. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place simultaneously, in the main room of the Family Center.

We have moved Adoration and Confession into the Family Center because we will be able to maintain both privacy and social distancing there. Confessions will be heard in the side rooms where the chairs for the priest and penitent will be at least six feet apart from each other. Anonymous and face-to-face options will be available.

For sacramental emergencies, please call us at the parish office. Though the office is closed and staff members are working from home, we are checking messages regularly and are ready to respond quickly.

We will continue to post Sunday Mass on our YouTube channel week by week. Last week's video of Mass for Laetare Sunday had over 1,400 views! We are so encouraged by this response, and we hope it grows each week. *Also, regarding the videos of Sunday Mass*: some viewers have brought to our attention that the lights inside the altar of sacrifice appear to cycle on and off during Mass. This is unintentional, and it is likely because of the LED lights' interaction with the video camera. It does not appear this way in person, and we hope this is not a source of distraction.


As a reminder, here is our current schedule:

Prayer to one's Guardian Angel when one cannot go to Mass

At the Consecration, with your seraphic strength, adore my Savior truly present, praying for those who have loved me, and for those who have offended me, and for those now deceased, that the Blood of Jesus may purify them all. During Holy Communion, bring to me the Body and Blood of Jesus, uniting Him with me in spirit, so that my heart may become His dwelling place. Plead with Him that through this sacrifice, all people throughout the world be saved.

When the Mass ends, bring home to me and to every home the Lord's blessing. Amen.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

The Friday before Palm Sunday is devoted to honoring the Seven Sorrows of our Blessed Mother. Further information will be provided.
