## Trumbull church hosts saint's heart

The Parish of St. Catherine of Siena hosted a religious relic, the heart of St.
John Vianney, earlier this
week, on Monday and Tuesday. This is the only public
event in the Diocese of
Bridgeport during the relic's
national tour that runs
through June.

According to Bridgeport

Diocese spokesman Brian Wallace, Vianney is the patron saint of parish priests and confessors.

Hartford Archbishop
Emeritus Daniel Cronin
celebrated Mass April 29 at
7 p.m. An all-night vigil
immediately following the
Mass ran until 7 a.m. April
30. Volunteers read excerpts
from Vianney's homilies
every hour on the hour.

On April 30, St.Catherine Pastor Joseph Marcello celebrated Mass at 9 a.m. Students from local Catholic schools attended.

St. John Vianney was born in 1786 and served as a parish priest in the French town of Ars. He was noted for his dedication to the poor, his counseling of those in need, for founding

an orphanage for girls, and for his work as a confessor.

Wallace said he spent as many as 18 hours a day hearing the confessions of people who had traveled from across Europe.
