HEY, lighten up!!

Last spring I discovered a new and exciting way to fish the season and it was all by accident, literally, I was home recovering from major shoulder surgery going stir crazy in the house when I was invited to ride along with a couple friends to Lake Geneva for

the day, well I just couldn't go empty handed so I took one rod just in case my arm could handle it, a medium light 6'2 rod and a small reel combo, I found that there was no fatigue after the day so when I recovered I brought that rod on every trip and started using it in all applications, spooled with 8# fire line for casting distance and strength with a fluorocarbon leader it was my go to rod for everything from rock bass, crappie, smallmouth and largemouth, I found my accuracy greatly improved and could handle bigger fish and a lot more fun, as we get older if your tiring out sooner that you want try downsizing your equipment, plus it can eliminate extra rods in the boat giving you more room and easier to pack for a trip, it was my primary rod for Winneconne catching white bass, largemouth, smallies and even a few northers. Try it, lighten up!!!

Tournament Changes

First, all boat owners are strongly encouraged to carry insurance, especially liability coverage. Participants must sign a waiver prior to fishing in a tournament.

As most are aware, we could not do a Tournament at Shabbona because the State doesn't allow Tournaments on weekends due to too much fishing pressure for a small lake. In lieu of Shabbona, we moved Big Green Lake to that Weekend of July 14th and 15th and in place of Big Green Lake, which was scheduled for October, we put Lake Kincaid on October 13th and 14th hoping that it would be a little warmer down south than in Wisconsin.

So now our Fishing Events are now set for the year. If you are going to Winneconne, be sure to let Amy know as soon as possible to reserve your room. Start getting your partners now and reserving your rooms, because at a number of our Fishing Events, there are Fishing Tournaments besides ours going on and as you well know, rooms go fast once people start signing up for these other Tournaments.
