

I read an article in an In-Fisherman Mag. about Musky fishing. The article discussed the pros and cons between trolling and casting. From past articles I learned that Jim Saric trolls the Chain using yellow birds. I have trolled a little but never used any trolling devices. Just a rod, line and lure.

The advantages of trolling are pretty obvious (although the article goes to great length computing coverage). You will cover more water (much more water) trolling than you can casting. Especially dragging multiple lures at multiple depths. Additionally, it is far less tiring than casting big Musky lures.

Got a great fish photo or story? Share it in our newsletter. Send photos and/or stories to your newsletter editor, Mike Noland at: <u>menoland@sbcglobal.net</u> The same weekend in 2010 I caught my 48" musky (see below), my partner caught a 47" musky trolling a bass lure in 30 feet of water.

Casting also has its advantages. Ever tried to troll in heavy timber?? I caught my 48" musky at Kinkaid in heavy, shallow timber. Then you have weed beds, inside corners and humps where trolling will only cause problems. Casting can be very effective at accurate positioning of lures and the ability to thoroughly covering key points.



Whichever method you decide to use, keep your options open and a positive attitude. If what your doing isn't working.....change tactics, lures, speed of retrieve or location (maybe even another lake or river). GOOD FISHING!!!
