

I have drawn and shown a love for animation since age two. My love of anime' grew when my family lived in Okinawa, Japan from 1991 to 1997. I have wanted to create my own cartoon since I was a teenager. My schooling has been nothing short of challenging from 3 ½ years old when I started, through graduating high school in 2009 and college in 2013. You won't find a more sincere, faithful and dedicated individual for your team.

While my social skills are a constant challenge, and I didn't work while attending school, you won't find a more sincere and dedicated employee as a valuable asset for your team, who has an endless desire to be a part of producing anime.
