Whereas, Larry Tamminen served the City of Carterville diligently through the years marking the Main Street as historic Route 66 with painted Route 66 emblems. Larry also took donations to line the Main Street with Route 66 Banners. Larry joined the Missouri Route 66 Association in 2004. He then started the Carterville Route 66 Association in 2005.

Whereas, in the summer of 2005, Larry sponsored Singer-Songwriter Mark Wesley Curran (an Elvis Presley impersonator) to come to Carterville and put on an Elvis impersonation concert. Larry served barbecue sandwiches and drinks with the money he raised going toward the Fire Department and the Police. Departments. He had opened his SuperTam Ice Cream and Superman Museum on September 26, 2005 until he sold it August 25, 2021.


